



Global Watch Daily – November 20, 2025

A concise summary of major developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

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Israel & Jerusalem

In Tel Aviv, actor Kevin Spacey made a notable return to the stage with a song-and-dance performance that was warmly received by local audiences ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, tensions continue to affect Israel's political landscape as the court and the governing coalition clashed over investigations related to the October 7 attacks and issues surrounding draft dodgers, marking day 776 of ongoing national challenges ([Times of Israel](#)).

Human Rights Watch has accused Israel of committing war crimes in connection with displacements in the West Bank. This charge adds to the international scrutiny of Israel's policies in the region ([Times of Israel](#)). Additionally, the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR) has been reported to offer cash rewards to encourage campus unrest, highlighting the complex networks behind ongoing tensions in academic environments ([Israel365 News](#)).

On the media front, the BBC has been criticized for what some describe as an anti-Israel propaganda machine, reflecting the contentious narratives surrounding the Israeli-Palestinian conflict ([JNS](#)). Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has also been reported to have different plans regarding the United Nations' efforts to establish a Palestinian state, indicating ongoing diplomatic complexities ([JNS](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu and senior officials recently visited the Syrian buffer zone as talks between Israel and Syria remain stalled, underscoring the fragile security situation on Israel's northern border ([Long War Journal](#)). In Gaza, Hamas has rejected a United Nations Security Council vote endorsing key aspects of a 20-point plan aimed at addressing the humanitarian crisis, signaling continued resistance to international proposals ([Long War Journal](#)).



Israeli military operations against Hezbollah in Lebanon were active during the week of November 10–16, reflecting ongoing efforts to counter threats from the northern front ([Long War Journal](#)). Meanwhile, U.S. lawmakers have emphasized that any civil nuclear agreement with Saudi Arabia must avoid triggering a regional arms race, highlighting concerns about the balance of power in the Middle East ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)).

The United States and Saudi Arabia continue to negotiate defense and economic deals, including potential sales of F-35 fighter jets, which could significantly impact the Middle Eastern strategic landscape ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)). Analysts note that such agreements could alter the regional balance of power, reflecting the ongoing complexity of alliances and rivalries in the area ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)).

Apostasy & Religious Developments

Recent discussions among Christian leaders highlight concerns about burnout among millennial Christians, with Karen Swallow Prior noting that this generation was set up for spiritual exhaustion due to cultural and church pressures ([Religion News Service](#)). In Catholic circles, figures like Nick Fuentes and the Groyper movement are challenging traditional Catholicism, reflecting broader tensions within religious communities ([Religion News Service](#)).

Social marginalization has been observed in various groups, with immigrants, student protesters, and Muslims described metaphorically as the “lepers of our time,” highlighting ongoing societal divisions ([Religion News Service](#)). Meanwhile, Christian communities face persecution in multiple regions: protests erupted in Nigeria following the killing of eight people and abduction of a pastor by terrorists ([Open Doors](#)), and in India, Christian advocates are calling for a national convention as persecution intensifies ([Open Doors](#)).

In Punjab, an organization is pushing for an anti-conversion law, citing the growth of the Christian population as a concern, which may further restrict religious freedom ([Open Doors](#)).

Biotechnology & Genetic Engineering

Scientists have made progress in cancer treatment by reawakening exhausted T cells to enhance immune responses against tumors, offering new hope for immunotherapy ([ScienceDaily](#)). In Alzheimer’s research, a simple molecule has demonstrated remarkable



symptom reversal in rat models, suggesting potential future therapies ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Inflammation has been identified as a factor that transforms bone marrow into a breeding ground for disease, potentially influencing the development of chronic illnesses ([ScienceDaily](#)). Additionally, research into amino acid metabolites is advancing as potential circulating biomarkers for sarcopenia, a muscle-wasting condition common in the elderly ([Nature](#)).

Technological innovations include the development of an MRI-guided high-intensity focused ultrasound (HIFU) robotic system for treating uterine fibroids, showing promise for non-invasive therapies ([Nature](#)). Furthermore, an industrial automated laboratory has been created to enable programmable protein evolution, potentially accelerating drug discovery and biotechnology applications ([Nature](#)).

In the commercial sector, Abbott announced plans to acquire Exact Sciences, a company specializing in cancer screening tests, in a \$21 billion deal that could expand liquid biopsy technologies ([STAT News](#)). Meanwhile, K Health is leveraging artificial intelligence and virtual care to increase accessibility to primary healthcare services ([STAT News](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Researchers studying a tiny ancient virus have uncovered secrets that could aid in combating antibiotic-resistant superbugs, offering new avenues for infectious disease control ([ScienceDaily](#)). In studies of Long COVID, researchers have identified strange microscopic structures in patients' blood, which may help explain persistent symptoms ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Historical research has revealed how a 14th-century story misled the world about the Black Death, providing insight into the interpretation of past pandemics ([ScienceDaily](#)). The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) recently published its 2023 annual epidemiological report on zoonotic influenza, highlighting ongoing risks of animal-to-human disease transmission ([ECDC](#)).

Additional ECDC reports cover communicable disease threats from October 11–17, 2025, and provide an overview of avian influenza cases from June to September 2025, underscoring the importance of vigilance in public health ([ECDC](#), [ECDC](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens



On November 20, 2025, seismic activity was recorded in several locations, including a magnitude 5.4 earthquake south of the Fiji Islands ([USGS](#)), a magnitude 2.1 quake near Glacier View, Alaska ([USGS](#)), and a smaller magnitude 1.3 tremor near Pacifica, California ([USGS](#)).

Volcanic activity continues at several sites, with the Fuego volcano emitting ash up to 15,000 feet, prompting aviation safety advisories ([VolcanoDiscovery](#)). Other active volcanoes reported on the same day include Santiaguito, Ibu, Reventador, Sangay, and White Island ([VolcanoDiscovery](#)).

In space exploration, NASA celebrated 25 years of human presence in space, marking a significant milestone in humanity's reach beyond Earth ([NASA](#)). Additionally, NASA's experimental X-59 aircraft completed its first flight and is preparing for further testing aimed at advancing supersonic travel technology ([NASA](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

European travelers using the Eurostar rail service face higher fares due to a new UK tax on the Channel Tunnel, which is affecting cross-border transportation costs ([Politico](#)). In the life sciences sector, Europe is advancing innovation in animal health and patient care, aiming to maintain leadership in the global innovation race ([Politico](#), [Politico](#)).

In the Middle East, Israeli air strikes in Gaza have resulted in at least 27 deaths, with the fragile ceasefire between Israel and Gaza fraying under renewed violence ([France24](#), [France24](#)). Netanyahu's visit to Israeli troops inside the Syrian buffer zone reflects rising tensions in the region ([France24](#)).

On the European front, the United States and Russia have proposed a peace plan for Ukraine that notably sidelines European involvement, raising questions about the future of diplomatic efforts ([France24](#), [France24](#)). Meanwhile, Spain continues to confront the legacy of the Franco dictatorship as symbols of that era persist in public spaces ([France24](#)).

In the United States, former President Donald Trump signed a bill mandating the Justice Department to release files related to Jeffrey Epstein, a move that has attracted significant public attention ([BBC](#)). U.S. military officials have been present in Kyiv amid warnings from Europe regarding a reported Russian peace plan for the ongoing conflict ([BBC](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts



Archaeological discoveries in Jerusalem's City of David continue to shed light on the region's ancient history. An Assyrian inscription dating from the First Temple period was recently uncovered, providing valuable historical context ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Additionally, the largest dam from ancient Israel was excavated in the same area, revealing advanced engineering capabilities of the time ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).

Among other notable finds is a rare gold coin belonging to Egyptian Queen Berenice II, discovered in the City of David, which highlights the interconnectedness of ancient civilizations ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Furthermore, a rare coin from the Year Four Revolt was found in Jerusalem, symbolizing the historical struggle for the redemption of Zion ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).
