### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Recent developments in Israel and Jerusalem highlight ongoing tensions and significant political and military actions. A Lithuanian court convicted the leader of a coalition party for inciting hatred against Jews, underscoring the persistent challenges of antisemitism in Europe ([Times of Israel](#)). In Israel, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has appointed his military secretary, Roman Gofman, as the next director of Mossad, signaling continuity in Israel's intelligence leadership ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, Israel and Lebanon held rare direct talks amid brewing conflict, marking a cautious diplomatic engagement between the two neighbors ([Times of Israel](#)).

In Gaza, former U.S. President Donald Trump hinted at a second phase of his Gaza plan as Israel recovered the body of a Thai national who had been held hostage and reopened the Rafah crossing to allow Palestinians to leave Gaza via Egypt ([Israel365 News](#); [BBC](#); [BBC](#)). The Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) confirmed the death of a Hamas battalion commander and his deputy, reflecting ongoing military operations in the region ([JNS](#)). Additionally, the Israeli Air Force struck Hezbollah terror targets in Lebanon, indicating heightened tensions on the northern border ([JNS](#)). Defense Minister Yoav Katz visited soldiers wounded in the recent Rafah battle, demonstrating government attention to the human cost of conflict ([JNS](#)).

The political and social climate also includes controversies such as the nomination of Tucker Carlson for “Antisemite of the Year,” reflecting ongoing debates about media and antisemitism ([Israel365 News](#)). The Pope's efforts in Lebanon have been described as struggling to gain traction amid the complex regional dynamics ([Israel365 News](#)). Furthermore, the Defense Ministry announced a military exercise on Highway 35, and the IDF issued an evacuation order for Tehran ahead of planned strikes, signaling preparations for potential escalations ([Jerusalem Post](#); [Jerusalem Post](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**



Security concerns remain high as Palestinian terrorists ambushed Israeli troops in Rafah, resulting in injuries to five IDF soldiers. The IDF also reported seven ceasefire violations by Gaza-based groups between November 27 and December 3, highlighting ongoing hostilities despite ceasefire efforts ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)). In the West Bank, the Palestinian Islamic Jihad continues to show signs of increased activity, raising concerns about regional stability ([Long War Journal](#)). Israel is also awaiting the return of the remains of the last two hostages from Gaza, a somber reminder of the ongoing human toll of the conflict ([Long War Journal](#)).

The question of Hezbollah's disarmament remains a critical issue for lasting peace in Lebanon. Analysts and policymakers debate whether Hezbollah should disarm to achieve stability, especially in light of Pope Francis's recent calls for peace in the region ([FDD](#); [FDD](#)). These developments underscore the fragile security situation in Israel and its neighboring countries.

## **Apostasy & Religious Developments**

Religious landscapes continue to shift with notable cultural and spiritual trends. The rise of the "Womanosphere," a movement blending faith, glamour, and traditional roles, has been observed, reflecting evolving expressions of Christianity among women ([Religion News](#)). At the same time, Muslim students have reported harassment by far-right Christian agitators, highlighting tensions between religious communities in some regions ([Religion News](#)). The Catholic military archbishop publicly condemned the intentional killing of noncombatants as illegal and immoral, emphasizing ethical concerns in modern warfare ([Religion News](#)).

Christian resources continue to encourage faithfulness and scriptural engagement. Podcasts and articles emphasize the Bible's relevance for personal life and community, addressing issues such as loneliness and the importance of scripture over digital distractions ([The Gospel Coalition](#); [The Gospel Coalition](#); [Crosswalk](#)). Meanwhile, a Methodist pastor publicly announced a male-to-female transition during a Sunday service, sparking discussion within the church community ([Crosswalk](#)).

Persecution of believers remains a grave concern. In Nigeria's Kogi state, terrorists kidnapped a pastor, his wife, and others during a church service, illustrating the dangers faced by Christians in certain regions ([Persecution.org](#)). In India, the Supreme Court upheld the dismissal of a Christian army officer, reflecting ongoing challenges for believers in public service ([Persecution.org](#)). Additionally, the United States has endorsed upcoming elections in Myanmar, diverging from international consensus and raising questions about



the political future of the country's Christian minority ([Persecution.org](https://www.persecution.org)).

## **Biotechnology & Genetic Engineering**

Advancements in biotechnology continue to yield new insights and pose new challenges. Scientists have captured flu viruses entering human cells in real time, providing valuable insights into viral infections and the development of treatments ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)). Research has also identified that gas stoves emit hidden toxic air pollutants in millions of homes, raising public health concerns ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)). Additionally, a routine shingles vaccination may provide robust protection against dementia, suggesting new preventive strategies for neurodegenerative diseases ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)).

Further studies have examined the enrichment of antibiotic resistance genes, virulence factors, and dangerous pathogens in biosolids-amended soils, highlighting environmental and health risks associated with waste management ([Nature](https://www.nature.com)). Innovative imaging techniques targeting CD45 have been developed to map whole-body inflammatory activity with high specificity, holding promise for translational medicine ([Nature](https://www.nature.com)). Researchers have also achieved high-throughput isolation of human alveolar epithelial cells, advancing the study of pulmonary fibrosis and lung diseases ([Nature](https://www.nature.com)). Meanwhile, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is undergoing leadership changes and policy reviews amid bipartisan criticism, signaling potential shifts in regulatory approaches to biotechnology and health care ([STAT](https://www.stat.com); [STAT](https://www.stat.com); [STAT](https://www.stat.com)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Global health authorities remain vigilant as new findings emerge regarding infectious diseases. Scientists have observed flu viruses surfing into human cells in real time, a breakthrough that may enhance understanding of viral transmission and infection mechanisms ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)). The shingles vaccine's potential to protect against dementia adds a promising dimension to preventive health strategies ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)).

Concerns about avian influenza have increased due to the virus's surprising heat tolerance, which may facilitate its spread in warmer climates and heighten risks of human exposure ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)). The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) has defined strategies to combat avian and swine flu in humans, emphasizing preparedness and response to potential zoonotic outbreaks ([ECDC](https://www.ecdc.europa.eu)). The ECDC also published scenarios for pre-pandemic zoonotic influenza preparedness, underscoring the importance of readiness for emerging infectious diseases ([ECDC](https://www.ecdc.europa.eu)). Widespread avian



influenza in bird populations continues to increase the risk of human exposure, highlighting the need for surveillance and control measures ([ECDC](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent natural events and astronomical observations have drawn attention worldwide. The Aoba Volcano experienced an intermittent low-level eruption reaching 6,000 feet (1,800 meters), prompting a volcanic ash advisory to monitor air traffic and public safety ([Volcano Discovery](#)). Similarly, the Puracé Volcano's volcanic ash advisory indicated that volcanic emissions were likely reaching 17,000 feet (5,200 meters), signaling ongoing volcanic activity in the region ([Volcano Discovery](#)).

Seismic activity was reported globally on December 4, 2025, including minor earthquakes near The Geysers, California (magnitude 0.8), Susitna, Alaska (magnitude 1.6), and Petrolia, California (magnitude 2.8), reflecting ongoing tectonic movements ([Volcano Discovery](#); [USGS](#); [USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

In space exploration, NASA celebrated 25 years of humanity in space with student art murals at the Johnson Space Center, highlighting the cultural impact of space missions ([NASA](#)). The Mars 2020 Perseverance rover detected electric sparks in dust devils and storms, providing new data on Martian atmospheric phenomena ([NASA](#)). Additionally, the Hubble Space Telescope is seeking star clusters in a "lost galaxy," contributing to our understanding of galaxy formation and evolution ([NASA](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

On the global stage, political and diplomatic developments continue to unfold. The European Union's efforts to cut red tape have been criticized by EU official Teresa Ribera as a "terrible political spectacle," reflecting challenges in governance and reform ([Politico](#)). A UK inquiry found Russian President Vladimir Putin "morally responsible" for the 2018 Novichok poisoning death in Britain, intensifying international scrutiny of Russia's actions ([Politico](#); [France24](#)).

Federica Mogherini resigned from her position at the College of Europe, marking a notable change in European academic and political circles ([Politico](#)). Direct talks between Israel and Lebanon have been described as a cautious step toward peace, reflecting tentative diplomatic progress amid ongoing tensions ([France24](#)). In related developments, Israel identified the remains of the latest returned hostage as a Thai national, following the Red



Cross's handover of presumed remains from Gaza ([France24](#); [France24](#)).

In the United States, former President Donald Trump is set to host the signing of a peace deal between the leaders of the Democratic Republic of Congo and Rwanda, signaling U.S. involvement in African peace initiatives ([BBC](#)). Additionally, Ukraine and U.S. negotiators plan to meet in Florida following talks in Moscow, indicating ongoing diplomatic efforts amid the Ukraine conflict ([BBC](#)). In Central Asia, Kazakhstan's Orda.kz news outlet was raided, and its editor was placed under house arrest, raising concerns about press freedom ([The Diplomat](#)). Meanwhile, Uzbekistan's peacebuilding efforts are under review regarding their sustainability in the region ([The Diplomat](#)). The strategic competition between China and the U.S. is expected to continue into 2026, shaping global geopolitical dynamics ([The Diplomat](#)).

### **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Archaeological discoveries continue to shed light on the ancient history of Jerusalem and the broader Middle East. An Assyrian inscription dating from the First Temple period was recently uncovered, providing valuable insights into the region's early history ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). The largest dam in ancient Israel was also discovered in the City of David, illustrating the advanced engineering capabilities of ancient inhabitants ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). A rare gold coin of Egyptian Queen Berenice II was found in the same area, highlighting the historical connections between Jerusalem and neighboring civilizations ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Additionally, a rare coin from the Year Four Revolt was discovered in Jerusalem, offering tangible evidence of the city's turbulent history and the Jewish revolts against foreign rule ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).

These developments resonate with biblical themes of conflict and restoration found in Ezekiel 38-39, where nations gather around Israel in turbulent times.

Religious and societal trends reveal both challenges and opportunities for the Church. The rise of new spiritual movements and the persecution of believers in various parts of the



world highlight the need for steadfast faith and courage. Meanwhile, advances in biotechnology and global health remind us of the ongoing battle against disease and the importance of wisdom in stewarding scientific progress. Natural disasters and cosmic phenomena continue to remind humanity of the Creator's sovereignty over the earth and heavens.

The archaeological discoveries in Jerusalem serve as a tangible connection to the biblical past, affirming the historical reality of God's covenant people and their land. As believers navigate these turbulent times, the Word of God remains a firm foundation, calling Christians to faithfulness, prayer, and hope in the promises of Scripture.
