### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Tensions remain high as former President Trump and Iranian officials exchanged sharp threats amid ongoing protests in Iran, with Trump warning that the U.S. will intervene if Iranian forces kill protesters ([Times of Israel](#)) ([BBC](#)). Israel’s Culture Minister sparked controversy by stating that Gaza belongs to Israel and Palestinians are merely guests there, a statement that underscores the complex and contested claims to the land ([Times of Israel](#)).

In a revealing report, Israel had requested Qatar to increase financial aid to Gaza just a month before the devastating events of October 7, highlighting the intricate and often paradoxical relationships in the region ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, Spanish Jewish communities expressed fears that a map identifying local Jewish and Zionist businesses could incite violence, reflecting ongoing concerns about antisemitism in Europe ([Times of Israel](#)).

In Ireland, hateful graffiti labeling Jews as “RAT JEW” was painted on a road, with police treating the incident as a hate crime, a stark reminder of the persistence of antisemitism in Western societies ([Times of Israel](#)). On a more technological front, Tel Aviv is set to build Israel’s first vertiport, paving the way for future air taxis and signaling a step forward in urban transportation innovation ([JNS](#)).

Qatar’s promotion of jihad through connections with the Muslim Brotherhood and Hamas continues to fuel regional instability ([JNS](#)). Israel condemned the harassment of a slain hostage’s family in Miami, emphasizing the need for dignity and respect even amid conflict ([JNS](#)). Military actions continue as Israel struck Hezbollah sites in southern Lebanon, maintaining pressure on hostile groups near its borders ([JNS](#)).

Israel launched a new five-year initiative to integrate minority groups into the tech industry, reflecting efforts to foster inclusivity and economic development ([JNS](#)). The IDF issued an evacuation order for Tehran ahead of anticipated strikes, signaling heightened military readiness ([Jerusalem Post](#)). Additionally, the Defense Ministry planned a military exercise on Highway 35, underscoring ongoing security preparations ([Jerusalem Post](#)).



Internationally, a Ukrainian drone attack forced the closure of Moscow's airport, escalating tensions between Russia and Ukraine ([Jerusalem Post](#)). The United States condemned the shooting of Colombian presidential candidate Miguel Uribe, reflecting concerns over political violence in Latin America ([Jerusalem Post](#)). In Europe, an Israeli man was arrested in Albania for attempting to leave with undeclared €194,000, highlighting issues of financial regulation and security ([Jerusalem Post](#)).

The United Arab Emirates announced its withdrawal from Yemen following Saudi strikes on separatist-held ports, marking a shift in regional military engagement ([BBC](#)). Meanwhile, Israel's recognition of Somaliland as an independent state has sparked controversy, reflecting the complexities of international diplomacy and recognition ([BBC](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Regional military activity remains intense as Jordan conducted airstrikes in Syria targeting drug smugglers, demonstrating ongoing efforts to combat illicit trafficking and maintain border security ([Long War Journal](#)) ([FDD](#)). The United Arab Emirates announced plans to withdraw forces from Yemen after Saudi demands and strikes, signaling a recalibration of alliances and military presence in the region ([Long War Journal](#)).

Israel continued its operations against Hezbollah in southern Lebanon, with strikes reported between December 22 and 28, 2025, maintaining pressure on this militant group ([Long War Journal](#)). Military rotations are underway in Gaza as a new phase of a ceasefire deal approaches, indicating ongoing strategic adjustments by the Israel Defense Forces ([Long War Journal](#)).

Beyond the Middle East, the United States conducted strikes against Islamic State targets in Nigeria, reflecting the global reach of counterterrorism efforts ([Long War Journal](#)). Syria's coastal region has seen a resurgence of sectarian violence, complicating the fragile stability in the war-torn country ([FDD](#)).

Saudi Arabia appears to be pivoting away from its previous moderation stance, a development that could have significant implications for regional politics and alliances ([FDD](#)). Meanwhile, protests in Iran have reached their fourth day, driven by economic collapse and currency devaluation, with calls for Washington to pay attention to the popular unrest ([FDD](#)) ([FDD](#)).

### **Global Macro & Geopolitics**
