Israel & Jerusalem

Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu has announced his intention to end U.S. military aid to Israel within the next decade, signaling a departure from the current 10-year assistance package scheduled to expire in 2028 ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, cultural connections continue to flourish as an Israeli-born couple introduces Moroccan musical heritage to a historically Black university in Louisiana, fostering greater cross-cultural understanding ([Times of Israel](#)). In regional diplomacy, Saudi Arabia has proposed reforms to the Palestinian Authority in exchange for governance over Gaza, presenting a potential pathway toward stability ([JNS](#)).

Concerns regarding antisemitism within American right-wing politics have been brought to light, with debates focusing on the implications for political figures such as Vice President Vance ([JNS](#)). On the security front, the Israel Defense Forces have issued evacuation orders for Tehran ahead of potential strikes, underscoring ongoing regional tensions ([Jerusalem Post](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Russia has deployed its new Oreshnik intermediate-range ballistic missile for a second time in Ukraine, a move likely intended to intimidate Western powers ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)). Meanwhile, Hamas and the Red Cross continue their search for the body of the last Gaza hostage amid ongoing ceasefire violations reported by the IDF, highlighting the fragile security situation ([Long War Journal](#)).

In Syria, the army has besieged Kurdish neighborhoods in Aleppo following clashes, marking a significant escalation after stalled integration talks with the Syrian Democratic Forces ([Long War Journal](#)). Additionally, geopolitical dynamics in Latin America are shifting as former President Trump's arrest of Maduro opens new opportunities and risks in the region ([FDD](#)).



Global Macro & Geopolitics

Protests in Iran persist amid reports of overwhelmed hospitals and intensifying crackdowns by authorities, reflecting ongoing domestic unrest ([BBC News](#)). In Europe, Switzerland mourns the victims of a deadly New Year's Eve fire in Crans-Montana, prompting national soul-searching and government scrutiny ([BBC News](#)).

Elon Musk's AI chatbot Grok faces criticism for generating sexualized images, raising ethical concerns among European officials and technology advocates ([France24](#)). Meanwhile, Greenlanders express unease over Trump's repeated claims about the island, sparking diplomatic tensions with Denmark and European allies ([France24](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Long COVID continues to affect millions worldwide, with new research linking symptoms to lingering viral presence, inflammation, and micro-clots. Experimental treatments are showing early promise in addressing these challenges ([ScienceDaily](#)). Scientists have also discovered "migrions," viral structures that enhance infection by delivering viral material collectively, challenging traditional models of infection ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Reassuringly, a recent study has reversed previous concerns about Tamiflu's safety in children, showing that the drug may reduce neuropsychiatric events linked to influenza ([ScienceDaily](#)). Additionally, research into mRNA COVID vaccines has elucidated mechanisms behind rare cases of heart inflammation, offering pathways to mitigate these risks ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Recent seismic activity includes minor earthquakes in California and Alaska, with magnitudes ranging from 0.9 to 1.6, posing no significant threat ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)). In space exploration, NASA is advancing preparations for the Artemis II crewed moon mission, with final integration and testing underway at the Kennedy Space Center ([NASA](#)).

Additional NASA projects are progressing, including the StarBurst instrument, which is completing extreme-temperature tests, and the Dragonfly rotorcraft, preparing for its mission to Saturn's moon Titan, marking significant milestones in space science ([NASA](#); [NASA](#)).
