### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Recent revelations highlight a daring 1979 Israeli operation that successfully evacuated the last 33 Israeli officials from Iran, a mission long untold but now brought to light by podcaster Mitch Ginsburg. Meanwhile, political maneuvers continue as Prime Minister Netanyahu plans to appoint UTJ's Eichler as deputy minister to advance legislation on the conscription of ultra-Orthodox men, signaling a potential reshuffle in the Knesset. These developments occur amid ongoing tensions in Tehran, where the IDF has issued evacuation orders ahead of anticipated strikes, underscoring the fragile security situation in the region ([Times of Israel](#); [JNS](#)).

In Iran, conflicting reports emerge about the fate of detained protester Erfan Soltani, with the judiciary denying plans for his execution while human rights groups claim postponement. The unrest reveals deep divisions among exiled opposition factions, notably between the son of the former shah and the Mujahedin-e Khalq, neither of which commands broad support. These internal fractures complicate the already volatile situation amid widespread protests and an internet blackout, with death toll figures varying across sources ([BBC News](#); [Times of Israel](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Military operations continue to shape the security landscape, with Israeli forces conducting strikes against Hezbollah in Lebanon, targeting the group's efforts to regenerate south of the Litani River. The Islamic Republic of Iran faces unprecedented internal challenges, as nationwide uprisings demand the end of the regime amid economic collapse and brutal crackdowns. This volatile environment is further complicated by Russian Orthodox propaganda targeting Patriarch Bartholomew, reflecting broader geopolitical and ideological conflicts in the region ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Amid these tensions, international observers note shifts in global alliances, with Chatham House highlighting the erosion of the Western alliance under US policy changes. The



Trump administration's revolutionary approach to foreign policy, including controversial moves regarding Greenland and Venezuela, signals a reshaping of the world order that could have lasting implications for regional stability and international law. ## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

The European military presence in Greenland is strengthening as France deploys troops, responding to US interest in the island amid strategic competition. Concurrently, US domestic security incidents, such as a federal agent shooting a Minneapolis man in self-defense, reflect ongoing internal challenges. On the diplomatic front, the Trump administration's hardening stance on trade is evident with the recall of the US ambassador to Vietnam and the suspension of immigrant visa processing for numerous countries, particularly in the Asia-Pacific region, signaling a more restrictive and assertive US foreign policy ([BBC News](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

The EU-Mercosur trade agreement gains qualified majority approval after decades of negotiation, despite fierce opposition from European agricultural sectors. Experts argue that the pact's benefits outweigh drawbacks, potentially reshaping economic relations between the blocs. ## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Innovative research from the University of Basel introduces a new test that distinguishes antibiotics that truly kill bacteria from those that merely inhibit growth, promising more precise treatments for infections like tuberculosis. Meanwhile, a striking real-world experiment found that flu patients did not transmit the virus to healthy volunteers despite close contact, emphasizing the importance of ventilation and masks in infection control. These findings contribute to a deeper understanding of infectious disease dynamics and prevention strategies ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Long COVID continues to affect millions globally, with emerging evidence linking symptoms to inflammation, micro-clots, and disrupted metabolism. Experimental treatments show promise, though definitive answers await larger trials. Additionally, scientists have discovered "migrions," viral structures that enhance infection spread by

### **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 2.0 earthquake near Loyal, Oklahoma, and a 1.3 magnitude tremor near Pacifica, California, both recorded by the USGS. Additionally, a 2.5 magnitude quake occurred east of Denali National Park, Alaska, indicating ongoing tectonic movements across diverse US regions.
