Cross-References

Psalm 67's call for universal recognition of God's salvation echoes the mission expressed in Isaiah 49:6, where Israel is called to be a light to the nations. The blessing motif resonates with Numbers 6:24-26, the priestly blessing that invokes God's favor and peace. The emphasis on God's equitable rule connects with Psalm 72, which also envisions a righteous king whose reign benefits all nations. Finally, the New Testament's Great Commission in Matthew 28:19-20 reflects the psalm's vision of all nations coming to know and praise God.
