Global Watch Daily – February 19, 2026

A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Hamas is solidifying its control over Gaza by seeking influential roles in postwar governance and policing, casting doubt on the feasibility of the US-backed peace plan. At the same time, Israel remains the primary target for cyberattacks worldwide, with pro-Russian hacktivist groups leading the offensive, underscoring persistent security challenges ([Times of Israel](#); [JNS](#)).

Archaeological findings at Tel 'Eton reveal that elders occupied the prime living spaces in Israelite homes during the Iron Age, offering valuable insight into family structures amid the Assyrian conquest. This discovery highlights the cultural continuity and resilience embedded in the region's history ([Times of Israel](#)).

In Iran, the IDF has issued evacuation orders for Tehran ahead of anticipated strikes, while the sentencing of detained Britons to lengthy terms reflects ongoing geopolitical tensions. Additionally, the arrest of the UK's former Prince Andrew adds complexity to the region's diplomatic landscape ([Jerusalem Post](#); [BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

The Syrian government and the Syrian Democratic Forces continue to implement their transition agreement, while the US maintains pressure on Islamic State through airstrikes and withdraws from the Tanf garrison. This development raises concerns about security and the management of detention sites in eastern Syria ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Hamas has renewed threats against rival Palestinian militias in Gaza, signaling an escalation of internal conflict and exposing the limits of Israeli military protection. These tensions further complicate the already fragile security situation in the Gaza Strip ([Long War Journal](#)).

Meanwhile, difficult negotiations between Russia and Ukraine continue amid strategic maneuvers by Putin, described as a "second-rate KGB agent." At the same time, regional



powers such as Thailand seek to reintegrate Myanmar into ASEAN, reflecting shifting geopolitical alliances across Asia ([FDD](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

A massive avalanche in California's Lake Tahoe region has resulted in eight confirmed deaths, with one person still missing, highlighting the dangers posed by natural disasters in populated areas. Concurrently, the search for Nancy Guthrie, a missing US mother, has expanded into Mexico as authorities intensify efforts to find leads ([BBC News](#)).

In France, custody has been extended for nine suspects involved in the killing of far-right activist Quentin Deranque, underscoring ongoing political violence. Meanwhile, U.S. President Trump has launched his controversial "Board of Peace," focusing on Gaza but excluding Palestinian representatives, raising concerns about undermining the UN's diplomatic role ([France24](#); [France24](#)).

In Southeast Asia, the Rohingya militant threat is evolving into a complex transnational issue involving crime and corruption, while Thailand's efforts to reintegrate Myanmar into ASEAN reflect regional initiatives aimed at stabilization and integration ([The Diplomat](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Innovations in cancer vaccines show promise as a reengineered HPV vaccine significantly enhances T cell responses, slowing tumor growth and extending survival in experimental models. Concurrently, a new CRISPR system offers hope against antibiotic-resistant superbugs by actively reversing drug resistance within bacterial populations ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Large-scale studies provide reassurance that mRNA COVID-19 vaccines administered during pregnancy do not increase the risk of autism, supporting vaccine safety. Meanwhile, research reveals how life experiences influence immune responses through epigenetic changes, explaining individual differences in disease severity ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Studies also highlight the rapid spread of respiratory viruses such as COVID-19 and H1N1 across US cities, emphasizing the critical need for early detection systems to mitigate future pandemics. Additionally, the discovery of a unique bacterial sugar offers a novel target for combating deadly superbugs resistant to antibiotics ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes a minor 0.2-magnitude earthquake near Cobb, California, and a 3.4-magnitude event near Calumet, Oklahoma, reflecting ongoing tectonic movements within the United States. Though minor, these events serve as reminders of the region's persistent geological activity ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

A vivid aurora display stretched across Iceland and eastern Canada during a minor geomagnetic storm, illustrating dynamic solar-terrestrial interactions. Additionally, new digital elevation models from Vantor's Precision3D product line have been incorporated into NASA's Satellite Data Explorer, enhancing Earth observation capabilities ([NASA](#); [NASA](#)).

Weather authorities continue to monitor areas affected by fire, winter, and severe weather, underscoring the importance of preparedness amid changing climate patterns. A 0.9 magnitude earthquake near Little Lake, California, was also recorded, adding to recent seismic activity in the state ([weather.gov](#); [USGS](#)).

## **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Recent developments include the Na'an 5/1951 excavation conducted in January 1951 on a hill southeast of Kibbutz Na'an (map ref. 187/643), following the discovery of graves and artifacts made of pottery and bronze. In 1978, an excavation took place in the village of Nahf (map ref. 230/760) on behalf of the Department of Antiquities and Museums, directed by F. Hasson. Additionally, the volume titled "77 | Khirbat 'Amra: A Rural Site from the Hellenistic to Early Islamic Periods in the Be'er Sheva' Valley" presents the final report of large-scale salvage excavations led by Gil Tahal for the Israel Antiquities Authority in 1993-1994 at the site of Khirbat 'Amra in the northern region ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).
