A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

Israel & Jerusalem

Karin Prien, granddaughter of Holocaust survivors and a prominent federal minister in Germany, may become the country's first president of Jewish descent, openly embracing her Jewish identity as a central influence on her political outlook ([Times of Israel](#)).

Meanwhile, Israel's pre-seed startup sector has experienced a 17% increase in valuation driven by AI competition, although the market is becoming more concentrated, with fewer investors making more bets ([JNS](#)).

Residents of mixed Haifa endure near-constant missile fire from Iranian and Hezbollah sources, severely impacting Christian, Muslim, and Jewish businesses alike as customers avoid the area, causing economic hardship ([Times of Israel](#)). In the broader regional context, former U.S. President Trump has urged Iranian negotiators to “get serious soon” in talks, warning of dire consequences if a deal is not reached ([JNS](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Tensions have escalated as Lebanon declared Iran's ambassador-designate persona non grata, shortly before an Iranian ballistic missile exploded over Lebanese airspace. This incident sparked speculation of retaliation, though investigations suggest the missile's target was outside Lebanon ([Long War Journal](#)). Concurrently, U.S.-Israeli strikes reportedly killed eight key Iranian regime figures, delivering a significant blow to Tehran's leadership ([FDD](#)).

In the strategic Strait of Hormuz, shipping expert Sal Mercogliano highlights Tehran's use of this critical chokepoint as leverage in regional conflicts, underscoring ongoing risks to global trade ([Long War Journal](#)). Additionally, an Iran-linked group has claimed responsibility for recent arson attacks in Antwerp and London, raising concerns about the spread of proxy actions in Europe ([Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics



Zimbabwe reports that 15 nationals were killed after being lured to fight for Russia, with ongoing efforts to repatriate bodies and survivors, highlighting the human cost of proxy conflicts ([BBC News](#)). Meanwhile, indirect peace talks between the U.S. and Iran continue, though a comprehensive deal remains distant amid complex demands ([BBC News](#)).

In economic developments, SpaceX is reportedly preparing an IPO that could value the company at \$1.75 trillion, signaling significant shifts in the aerospace and technology sectors ([France24](#)). Italy's Prime Minister Meloni announced plans to enhance cooperation with Algeria on gas deliveries, aiming to bolster the European Union's energy security ([France24](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Scientists have discovered antibiotics accumulating in a major Brazilian river, including banned drugs found in fish sold for food, raising new concerns about human exposure and food safety ([ScienceDaily](#)). Concurrently, a shingles vaccine shows promise in reducing heart risk by nearly half, offering a powerful protective effect against cardiac events and deaths ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Researchers at MIT have identified a gut protein, intelectin-2, that forms a protective barrier by trapping and killing harmful bacteria, including antibiotic-resistant strains, potentially opening new avenues for gut health therapies ([ScienceDaily](#)). Meanwhile, DNA origami vaccines are emerging as the next step beyond mRNA technology, demonstrating strong immune responses in early studies and offering more stable, easier-to-manufacture vaccines ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 0.8 earthquake near Cobb, California, and a magnitude 1.1 earthquake near Julian, California, both recorded by the USGS ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)). Additionally, a magnitude 1.7 quake was detected near Tanaina, Alaska ([USGS](#)).

NASA reports a hot start to spring in the U.S. Southwest, with several states experiencing record March temperatures exceeding 100 degrees Fahrenheit, signaling notable climate patterns ([NASA](#)). Severe thunderstorms are forecast for the mid-Mississippi and Ohio Valley regions, alongside record warmth and fire weather concerns ([weather.gov](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts



Archaeologists have uncovered a Byzantine church with colorful mosaic floors at Nitzana in the Negev, shedding light on early Christian history in the region ([BiblePlaces](#)).

Excavations in Upper Egypt revealed around 3,000 ostraca pottery fragments, bringing the total to approximately 43,000—the largest known collection from a single site—offering rich insights into ancient Egyptian life ([BiblePlaces](#)).
