### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Israeli forces have intensified their strikes against Hezbollah targets in Lebanon, successfully dismantling rocket launchers and escalating regional tensions. The military confirmed the death of Ali Shoeib, a journalist affiliated with Hezbollah, an event that has attracted international attention and condemnation. In the United Kingdom, a man originally from India was arrested for attempted murder following a car attack that injured seven pedestrians; however, authorities have sought to downplay broader public alarm. These incidents occur amid subdued Passover and Easter celebrations in Jerusalem, where missile fragments have forced cancellations and restrictions on religious gatherings ([Times of Israel](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Iran's president has issued stark warnings of economic collapse without a ceasefire and the restoration of civilian government powers, highlighting internal political tensions. The broader context is marked by accusations of widespread brutality and lawlessness in Gaza, with some observers describing US and Israeli actions as genocidal. These developments underscore the fragile security situation in the region and the complex interplay of military, political, and humanitarian factors ([Al Jazeera](#); [Times of Israel](#); [JNS](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

The Iran-backed Houthis have escalated their involvement in the regional conflict by launching missile and drone attacks against southern Israel, marking their first direct military action since the US-Israeli campaign against Iran began in late February. These assaults, targeting cities such as Beersheva, form part of a broader pattern of Iranian and proxy attacks on energy infrastructure and residential areas across the Arabian Peninsula, including Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Bahrain. The complexity of the conflict is further highlighted by humanitarian efforts in Sudan, where volunteer-led aid networks have gained international recognition for their impartial support amid ongoing violence ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [Chatham House](#)).



Alongside these military developments, innovative policy initiatives are emerging. A recent AI policy hackathon saw young participants propose creative strategies for government adoption of artificial intelligence, including AI-assisted security systems and integrated health and social care platforms. This forward-looking approach amid ongoing regional instability illustrates the multifaceted challenges and opportunities facing the region today ([Chatham House](#); [FDD](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

Iranian attacks continue across the Gulf, targeting major industrial sites such as aluminum facilities in the UAE and Bahrain, resulting in injuries and heightened regional tensions. In Jerusalem, Israeli police barred Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa from celebrating Palm Sunday mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, an incident condemned by Italy's Prime Minister as an offense to the faithful. Meanwhile, France thwarted a bomb attack outside a Bank of America branch in Paris, underscoring persistent security threats in Europe. These events reflect a volatile geopolitical landscape marked by conflict, religious sensitivities, and terrorism concerns ([BBC News](#); [France24](#); [France24](#)).

In East Asia, geopolitical alliances are evolving amid a recalibration of the Japan-South Korea-US techno-alliance, with a focus on advanced technology and economic security. Social dynamics in Tokyo reveal challenges in public spaces, where transactional encounters limit genuine community interactions. ## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Recent scientific breakthroughs have identified immune cells associated with long COVID fatigue, offering hope for understanding persistent symptoms among patients with initially mild infections. Concurrently, concerns are rising over antibiotic contamination in Brazilian river fish, highlighting food safety risks and environmental challenges. Advances in vaccine technology continue with DNA origami vaccines showing promise beyond mRNA, potentially improving stability and immune response for diseases such as COVID-19 and HIV ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Additional discoveries include tiny rocket engines inside malaria parasites that may lead to novel drug targets, and a gut protein, intelectin-2, which traps and kills dangerous bacteria, enhancing gut defense. A shingles vaccine has also been found to significantly reduce the risk of heart attack and stroke, underscoring the interconnectedness of

### **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Seismic activity has been recorded in multiple locations across the United States, including a magnitude 1.1 earthquake near Anchorage, Alaska, and similar tremors in California near Ocotillo Wells and Cobb. These minor quakes, monitored by the USGS, pose no immediate threat but underscore ongoing geological activity in these regions. Meanwhile, NASA continues its Artemis lunar program, selecting Intuitive Machines to deliver science payloads to the Moon, advancing human space exploration. The agency also highlights personnel like Erik Richards, whose career supports critical space communications, reflecting the human element behind technological achievements ([USGS](#); [NASA](#); [NASA](#)).

### **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Archaeological discoveries continue to illuminate ancient Middle Eastern history. A shipwreck off the coast of Dor has revealed smelted iron chunks dating to circa 600 BC, providing evidence of early iron trade. Additionally, excavations at Nitzana in the Negev uncovered a Byzantine church adorned with colorful mosaics, while a lead sling bullet inscribed with the Greek word for “learn” was found at Hippos, illustrating local defenders’ use of humor in warfare.
