Global Watch Daily – April 26, 2026

### **Israel & Jerusalem**

The Israeli Cabinet unanimously approved its first ambassador to Somaliland, marking a significant diplomatic milestone as Michael Lotem, who recently completed a tour in East Africa, assumes the new role. Meanwhile, President Herzog is reportedly working to advance a plea deal for Netanyahu, despite no pardon being planned at this stage, amid pressure from U.S. President Trump. Local elections proceeded in parts of the West Bank and Gaza, though key groups such as Hamas abstained, reflecting ongoing political complexities in the region. These developments unfold alongside international tensions, including the cancellation of U.S. envoys' trip to Pakistan for Iran war talks, underscoring the fragile geopolitical landscape ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

In a remarkable sporting achievement, Kenya's Sebastian Sawe became the first man to run a sub-two-hour marathon in London, breaking the previous world record and highlighting East Africa's dominance in distance running. Meanwhile, a timeline of assassination attempts on Donald Trump was released, revealing multiple security incidents during his presidency and campaign rallies. These events contribute to the broader narrative of political and social unrest impacting Israel and its allies. ### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Russia is expanding its unmanned systems capabilities by recruiting for a new brigade affiliated with its Shahed drone manufacturer, highlighting Moscow's strategic emphasis on drone warfare. Concurrently, the Houthis in Yemen reaffirmed their steadfast support for Iran despite limited involvement in the recent war with Israel and the U.S., and are reportedly considering imposing a toll on Red Sea shipping lanes, a move that could disrupt international trade. These developments underscore the volatile security environment in the Middle East, with proxy conflicts and military innovations shaping the regional balance ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).



The question of Iran's leadership remains uncertain, complicating diplomatic efforts as U.S. envoys prepare for negotiations in Pakistan amid an extended Israel-Lebanon ceasefire. Meanwhile, former NATO Secretary-General Lord Robertson criticized the UK's overreliance on the U.S., calling for greater military autonomy and cooperation with European allies to deter Russian aggression. Additionally, Chatham House experts testified to the UK Parliament on China's dominance in critical minerals, emphasizing the need for strategic resilience. These insights reflect the interconnected challenges of regional security, great power competition, and alliance dynamics ([FDD](#); [Chatham House](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

Coordinated attacks by armed groups across Mali, including the killing of Defense Minister Sadio Camara in an al-Qaeda-linked assault, signal escalating instability in the region. Fighting continues in northern Mali's Kidal city between the army and Tuareg rebels allied with jihadists, marking the largest jihadist offensive in years. These violent clashes coincide with surveillance footage revealing the suspect in the recent correspondents' dinner incident evading security checkpoints, underscoring ongoing security threats. The broader geopolitical context includes reflections on the Soviet Union's top-down culture contributing to the Chernobyl disaster, illustrating how governance failures can have catastrophic consequences ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).

China's military-civil fusion strategy, once a major irritant in U.S.-China relations, has been quietly continued despite Beijing's public silence, reflecting the strategic competition between the two powers. Additionally, China's establishment of a new county signals its intent to deepen integration with Afghanistan and Central Asia, highlighting Beijing's expanding regional influence. These geopolitical shifts underscore the evolving global power dynamics and the strategic recalibrations underway among major nations ([The Diplomat](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

A newly confirmed ancient mass grave in Jordan reveals the devastating impact of the Plague of Justinian, showing how entire communities were wiped out rapidly, a stark reminder of pandemics' societal reshaping power. Modern scientific advances include the discovery of a hidden virus in gut bacteria that is linked to colon cancer, offering potential for earlier screening and a better understanding of disease risk. Additionally, a skincare compound derived from *Centella asiatica* shows promise for killing drug-resistant bacteria by targeting unique bacterial proteins, offering a promising new avenue for antibiotics.



These findings highlight the ongoing battle against infectious diseases and the importance of innovative research ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Further research reveals bacteria can “explode” to spread antibiotic resistance via gene transfer agents, a mechanism repurposed from ancient viruses, complicating efforts to combat superbugs. Public health studies also identify that the dirtiest surfaces in public restrooms are often not toilet seats but high-touch areas like door handles and flush levers, with “toilet plumes” posing airborne risks when flushing without lids. These insights underscore the complexity of microbial transmission and the need for improved hygiene practices to protect public health ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

### **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes multiple earthquakes in Alaska, Hawaii, and California, with magnitudes ranging from 1.1 to 2.0, closely monitored by the USGS to assess potential risks. NASA continues to inspire with its Artemis II mission, featuring flight manager Peter Rossoni, who supports optical communications as astronauts orbit the Moon, symbolizing progress in human exploration. The Hubble Space Telescope released a detailed image of the Trifid Nebula to celebrate the 36th anniversary of its launch and showcase the beauty and complexity of star formation. Meanwhile, severe weather events, including thunderstorms and wildfires, have been forecasted, emphasizing the ongoing challenges posed by natural disasters and climate variability (USGS; NASA).

### **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Excavations near ‘Akko’s Land Gate uncovered remnants of a late Ottoman to early British Mandate roadside coffeehouse, revealing a blend of local traditions and international trade through artifacts such as European porcelain and tobacco pipes. Similarly, pottery finds from the Iron Age II through Ottoman periods at Tel Yafo provide valuable insights into the material culture and economic contacts of the region’s inhabitants, aiding in dating architectural features and reconstructing ancient urban environments. These archaeological discoveries enrich understanding of cultural exchange and continuity in the Middle East, highlighting the historical layers beneath modern cities. Recent reports also spotlight collections of painted sarcophagi and papyrus scrolls from Egypt’s Third Intermediate Period, as well as the unearthing of a temple dedicated to the god Pelusius, further illustrating the region’s rich heritage ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [BiblePlaces](#)).
