Global Watch Daily – May 14, 2026

A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Israel recently held a memorial ceremony at Mount Herzl to honor soldiers who fell during the Six-Day War and the 1967-70 War of Attrition, highlighting the nation's enduring respect for its fallen heroes ([JNS](#)). Meanwhile, despite ongoing Israeli military operations, Hezbollah continues to enjoy significant support in southern Lebanon, where many locals regard the group as their primary defense force ([BBC News](#)). In regional diplomacy, Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu reportedly made a secret visit to the UAE amid the conflict with Iran; however, the UAE officially denied these claims, emphasizing that no unofficial arrangements exist ([BBC News](#)). Additionally, Iran's seizure of a commercial vessel near the UAE port of Fujairah signals escalating tensions in the Strait of Hormuz ([JNS](#)).

On the global stage, US President Donald Trump and Chinese leader Xi Jinping praised their countries' relationship as one of the most consequential in the world, signaling a strategic partnership despite ongoing regional conflicts ([Al Jazeera](#)). In popular culture, pioneering mixed martial artists Ronda Rousey and Gina Carano ended lengthy retirements to face off in a highly anticipated Netflix bout, capturing global attention beyond geopolitical concerns ([Al Jazeera](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Reports of a secret Israeli military base in Iraq's Najaf desert have stirred controversy among Iraqi politicians and security forces, reflecting the complex interplay of regional powers, including Iran-backed militias and the United States ([Long War Journal](#)). Israel recently assassinated Ahmad Ghaleb Ballout, commander of Hezbollah's Radwan Force, marking the first strike in Beirut's metropolitan area since the ceasefire began and indicating ongoing covert operations ([Long War Journal](#)). Furthermore, advanced facial recognition technology has identified three perpetrators involved in the October 7 Hamas-led massacre, demonstrating the growing role of technology in modern conflict intelligence ([Long War Journal](#)).



Russia's Duma has granted President Putin expanded military powers to protect citizens abroad, reflecting heightened geopolitical tensions ([FDD](#)). Concurrently, Trump's state visit to China commenced amid ongoing conflict in Iran, highlighting the complex diplomatic landscape ([FDD](#)). Despite the degradation of Iran's nuclear program, concerns persist over its potential chemical contingencies, as experts warn of ongoing threats ([Long War Journal](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

Russian strikes across Ukraine have caused civilian casualties, including the tragic death of a 12-year-old girl, underscoring the ongoing humanitarian crisis ([BBC News](#)). In Africa, the M23 rebels, backed by Rwanda, have withdrawn from several positions under US diplomatic pressure, enabling the Congolese army to regain control in eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo ([France24](#)). Ghana evacuated 300 citizens from South Africa following xenophobic attacks, highlighting regional instability and migration challenges ([France24](#)).

In a governance and economics case, former Nigerian Power Minister Saleh Mamman was sentenced to 75 years in prison in a rare corruption verdict, though his current whereabouts remain unknown (BBC News). Meanwhile, Malaysian financier Jho Low reportedly sought a pardon from US President Trump amid accusations of masterminding a \$4.5 billion theft from a state investment fund (The Diplomat). Australia's efforts to locate oil reserves in East and Southeast Asia reveal a lack of understanding of the region's geology, raising questions about its energy strategies ([The Diplomat](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Scientists at the University of Maryland have uncovered a critical mechanism used by enteroviruses, including those that cause polio and the common cold, to replicate inside human cells, offering promising avenues for antiviral therapies ([ScienceDaily](#)). In parallel, researchers have identified natural compounds from a Brazilian tree that attack COVID-19 on multiple fronts, potentially reducing viral resistance ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Innovative approaches to oral health have emerged, with scientists discovering methods to prevent gum disease by disrupting bacterial communication rather than killing beneficial bacteria, highlighting the complexity of the oral microbiome ([ScienceDaily](#)). Meanwhile, free-living amoebae are spreading globally due to warming temperatures and aging water systems, posing new health risks and emphasizing the need for improved



surveillance and water treatment ([ScienceDaily](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 1.6 earthquake near Holtville, California, along with smaller tremors in Alaska, reflecting ongoing tectonic activity in these regions ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)). Additionally, spring melt along Alaska's Kuskokwim River has caused ice jams and flooding, demonstrating the seasonal impacts on local environments ([NASA](#)).

Technological advances from NASA's lunar habitat 3D printing have found practical applications on Earth, improving construction efficiency and aesthetics ([NASA](#)). Fire weather concerns and severe weather warnings have been issued for large parts of the central United States, highlighting ongoing climate-related risks ([weather.gov](#)).

## **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Recent archaeological publications by the Israel Antiquities Authority have shed new light on the Abu Ghosh site (A-9347), providing detailed maps and plans of the building and winepress areas, thereby contributing to a deeper understanding of ancient settlement patterns ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)). Concurrently, BiblePlaces has reported on excavations at Nineveh's Shamash Gate and ongoing studies of enigmatic artifacts such as the Copper Scroll, offering valuable insights into biblical-era administrative systems ([BiblePlaces](#)).

Further research into seal impressions discovered in Jerusalem aims to clarify administrative practices during Old and New Testament times, while new theories about the Copper Scroll suggest it may have listed donations to Bar Kochba, enriching the discourse in biblical archaeology ([BiblePlaces](#)).
