### **Israel & Jerusalem**

On Memorial Day, a U.S. diplomat honored the sacrifice of courageous Americans who defended natural rights, emphasizing the enduring importance of freedom. Meanwhile, Iran remains cautious, with no imminent deal expected despite U.S. optimism about a possible agreement early next week. President Trump has stated that any forthcoming pact will differ significantly from the previous nuclear accord, underscoring a firm negotiating stance. Hamas has reportedly replaced its military wing leader, signaling shifts within the organization even as ceasefire violations continue in Gaza. Meanwhile, millions of pilgrims continue to gather in Mecca for Hajj, undeterred by regional security concerns, reflecting enduring religious commitments amid geopolitical tensions. ## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 0.9 earthquake near Johannesburg and a magnitude 1.7 event northwest of Yakutat, Alaska, both recorded by the USGS. NASA continues to engage the public with calls for creative storytelling partners to highlight missions such as Artemis Moon explorations and nuclear propulsion advancements. Upcoming live coverage of a Roscosmos spacewalk outside the International Space Station is scheduled, emphasizing ongoing international cooperation in space. ## **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Recent archaeological publications by the Israel Antiquities Authority shed light on significant artifacts, including Karmiyya (A-9352), and on findings from Horbat Sussita (Hippos), enriching our understanding of ancient Near Eastern history. Radiocarbon dating challenges previous assumptions about the Ein Hatzeva granary's origins, attributing its construction to Jeroboam II of Israel rather than Assyria. Additionally, Egyptian authorities have unveiled a plaster blocking wall from King Tutankhamun's tomb, a rare survival against ancient looters, alongside restoration efforts on the tombs of Amenhotep and his son, Samut.
