### **Israel & Jerusalem**

The Israeli Defense Forces carried out extensive strikes against 150 Hezbollah targets in Southern Lebanon and the Beqaa Valley, focusing on infrastructure and operatives to diminish militant capabilities. Simultaneously, an Israeli strike in Gaza City resulted in the death of Mohammed Odeh, the newly appointed head of Hamas’s military wing, highlighting ongoing tensions despite a ceasefire. The release of Emily Hand, who was abducted by Hamas nearly 32 months ago, represents a poignant moment of hope for rebuilding lives in Kibbutz Be’eri. These events underscore the persistent conflict dynamics in the region and the deeply human stories intertwined with them ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

In Iran, the end of a government-imposed internet blackout—initiated after the outbreak of war with the US and Israel—brought relief to many citizens who had felt isolated from the outside world. This development contrasts with the ongoing political turmoil in Spain, where police entered the headquarters of Prime Minister Sanchez’s Socialist Party amid corruption investigations, reflecting broader regional instability. Meanwhile, celebratory events in the United States, such as a UFC bout held on the White House lawn to commemorate the nation’s 250th anniversary and President Trump’s 80th birthday, present a stark juxtaposition to conflict zones ([BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Hezbollah’s evolving tactics, particularly the deployment of inexpensive FPV drones, are reshaping the battlefield by circumventing Israeli defenses and targeting troops, signaling a shift in asymmetric warfare. Meanwhile, Syria continues to face security threats, including a recent car bombing in Damascus and raids against militants, while pursuing diplomatic engagement with Kurdish groups and the international community. These developments unfold amid broader regional efforts to stabilize and recalibrate power dynamics, including the legacy of the Abraham Accords and Iran’s complex influence in Lebanon. The strategic landscape remains fluid as Israel strives to maintain security and diplomatic gains ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).



On the geopolitical front, President Trump is recognized for his peacemaking efforts, particularly the Abraham Accords that normalized relations between Israel and several Arab states, marking a significant shift in Middle Eastern diplomacy. Concurrently, debates on energy policy continue, with experts advising against new investments in North Sea oil due to market realities and emphasizing electrification and renewable energy as the future path. These factors collectively influence regional security and economic stability, highlighting the interconnected nature of military, diplomatic, and energy considerations ([FDD](#); [Chatham House](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

Recent rulings and diplomatic gestures reflect ongoing global shifts: Italy's Supreme Court upheld a hotel's right to refuse tap water to tourists, emphasizing nuances in consumer law, while Ghana welcomed the Pope's apology for the Catholic Church's historical role in slavery, marking a significant step toward reconciliation. In the Middle East, Israel's defense ministry confirmed the killing of Hamas's new military leader in Gaza, underscoring the persistent intensity of the conflict. On the scientific front, NASA unveiled ambitious plans for a moon base featuring landers, rovers, and drones, signaling renewed momentum in space exploration. Additionally, China's deployment of the new Type 054B frigate with the Liaoning carrier group in the Western Pacific highlights growing naval capabilities and regional power projection ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).

India's Prime Minister Modi's visits to Sweden and Norway extend beyond trade, aiming to establish Arctic credentials despite challenges posed by Russia, reflecting strategic ambitions in the Nordic region. These developments illustrate the complex interplay of legal, historical, military, scientific, and diplomatic factors shaping the global landscape. ## **Pestilence & Global Health**

NASA's upcoming Artemis III mission update and crew announcement promise to advance human presence in space, while weather agencies highlight excessive rainfall and severe thunderstorms in the Northern Plains and Four Corners region, along with fire weather concerns. ## **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Recent archaeological publications reveal significant findings in the Middle East, including detailed studies of the El'ad (A-8478) and Legio (A-9683) artifacts, which shed light on ancient historical contexts. Radiocarbon dating of seeds from the Ein Hatzeva granary challenges previous assumptions by attributing the fortress's construction to Jeroboam II of Israel rather than Uzziah of Judah, offering fresh perspectives on regional power dynamics in the early 8th century BC. Additionally, Egyptian authorities unveiled a plaster blocking wall from King Tutankhamun's tomb in Luxor, an unparalleled artifact that survived ancient looting, while restoration efforts continue on the tombs of Amenhotep and his son Samut.
