### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Israeli Defense Minister reiterated firm threats to strike targets in Beirut in response to recent rocket launches by Hezbollah, underscoring Israel's determination to defend its borders amid persistent regional tensions ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

In a continued effort to pursue justice and accountability, Israel is preparing to indict a Hamas terrorist responsible for holding the body of IDF soldier Oron Shaul for nearly a decade, reflecting the nation's commitment to addressing wartime atrocities ([JNS](#)).
