### **Israel & Jerusalem**

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Russia is intensifying its efforts to rebuild and strengthen its military capabilities by reopening several officer training institutions, including the Chelyabinsk Higher Tank Command School. This move signals Moscow's determination to replenish its armed forces following substantial losses sustained in Ukraine ([Long War Journal](#)). Meanwhile, in the Middle East, the Houthi movement in Yemen has publicly reaffirmed its solidarity with the Iran-led Axis of Resistance, which includes Hezbollah and Hamas. This ongoing alliance perpetuates the complex network of regional proxy conflicts that continue to challenge peace initiatives ([FDD](#)).

Despite Israel's sustained efforts to suppress Hamas in Gaza, the group maintains active guerrilla-style resistance across multiple fronts, including operations in Lebanon and Iran. This underscores the persistent and multifaceted nature of conflict in the region, with no immediate resolution in sight ([Long War Journal](#)). Concurrently, Iraq's government is making strides to assert control over Iranian-backed militias by integrating them under state authority. This development could significantly alter the regional balance of power by reducing militia autonomy and strengthening central governance ([Long War Journal](#)).

Iran's oil exports have been effectively reduced to zero in May due to stringent American sanctions and maritime blockades. This severe curtailment places considerable financial strain on the Iranian regime and influences the broader regional power dynamics ([FDD](#)). In parallel, Hezbollah has rejected a U.S.-brokered ceasefire proposal with Israel, reflecting entrenched resistance to diplomatic overtures and ongoing hostility in the region ([FDD](#)).



The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) continues to face significant challenges in fully monitoring Iran's nuclear activities, raising concerns about transparency and the potential for nuclear proliferation ([FDD](#)). Meanwhile, Syria is engaging diplomatically with the United States to promote regional reconstruction and seek sanctions relief. These efforts occur amid shifting alliances and the emergence of new trade routes, which collectively impact the broader Middle Eastern geopolitical landscape ([Long War Journal](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

The rise of xenophobic violence in South Africa has compelled Malawi and other African nations to repatriate their citizens, highlighting the social and political strains caused by migration pressures and ethnic tensions across the continent ([BBC News](#)). In Armenia, democratic backsliding is evident amid extreme political polarization and pervasive hate speech, complicating the country's delicate transition between war and peace and its strategic balancing act between reliance on Russia and aspirations for Western integration ([France24](#)).

Thailand has committed to participating in United Nations-backed conciliation efforts to resolve its maritime dispute with Cambodia. This decision reflects a willingness to pursue peaceful dispute resolution despite ongoing regional tensions ([The Diplomat](#)). Economically, Chile's inflation rate rose less than anticipated, providing some relief ahead of an upcoming interest rate decision. Meanwhile, U.S. stock futures indicate a modest rebound following recent declines, underscoring the fragile state of the global economy ([Bloomberg](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

In a strategic move to maintain maritime security, U.S. allies are seeking former President Donald Trump's approval for a Europe-led mission to clear mines from the Strait of Hormuz, a critical chokepoint for global energy supplies ([Bloomberg](#)). Concurrently, currency markets are experiencing stress as trade disruptions between Iran and Israel affect emerging-market currencies, including the Indian rupee, illustrating the broader economic ripple effects of regional conflicts ([Bloomberg](#)).

In the United Kingdom, Prime Minister Keir Starmer has urged major technology companies to take stronger measures to prevent the circulation of nude images among young people. ## **Pestilence & Global Health**



Scientists have achieved a milestone by completing the first human trial of an AI-designed universal coronavirus vaccine. This vaccine elicited immune responses against multiple coronaviruses, including SARS-CoV-2 and related bat viruses, aiming to provide broad and durable protection as these viruses continue to evolve ([ScienceDaily](#)).

New research has challenged previous assumptions regarding cancer metastasis, revealing that melanoma spread peaks in middle age rather than in old age. This phenomenon is linked to immune system dynamics that maintain cancer dormancy, offering valuable insights for developing improved treatment strategies ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Contrary to expectations, brain imaging studies of long COVID patients show no evidence of widespread brain inflammation. Instead, severe symptoms correlate with increased activity in brain regions responsible for mood and emotion regulation, suggesting new avenues for understanding and managing post-viral syndromes ([ScienceDaily](#)).

### **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

The Philippines has experienced intense seismic activity, including a devastating 7.8 magnitude earthquake that caused significant destruction and loss of life. This event was followed by numerous aftershocks ranging from magnitude 1.7 to 5.6, affecting millions and prompting tsunami warnings. These developments underscore the region's vulnerability to natural disasters ([USGS](#); [GDACS](#)).

Additional smaller earthquakes in Hawaii and the Philippines continue to remind observers of the earth's dynamic nature. Monitoring agencies provide real-time data to support disaster preparedness and response efforts ([USGS](#); [GDACS](#)).

### **Middle Eastern Artifacts**
