Global Watch Daily – June 23, 2026

A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Recent reports highlight efforts to expand the Abraham Accords, with Asher Fredman, director for Israel at the Abraham Accords Peace Institute, emphasizing the urgency to “move forward and realize the potential of the Abraham Accords 2.0.” Meanwhile, former U.S. President Donald Trump asserted that nuclear talks with Iran would have collapsed if Tehran had not agreed to comprehensive nuclear inspections, stating that “Iran has fully and completely agreed to highest level nuclear inspections long into the future.” However, Iran’s foreign ministry clarified that no new commitments were made regarding nuclear site inspections following discussions in Switzerland ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

The United Nations commission of inquiry released a report accusing Israel of committing genocide in Gaza by deliberately targeting children, a charge Israel vehemently rejects, labeling the report a “libellous sham.” Concurrently, Israeli fire killed two individuals in Lebanon, prompting Hezbollah to condemn the incident as a “blatant” violation of the truce. In a different context, Arab fans gathered in New York to celebrate the World Cup results, expressing solidarity with all Arab teams participating in the tournament ([BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Additional coverage reveals that an Israeli supermarket chain, Victory, reported a significant financial gain from Gaza, with 65% of its 152 million shekel (\$50 million) first-quarter year-over-year growth attributed to sales in the Strip, raising questions about commercial activities in the region. Israel also reported no confirmed Ebola cases after two suspected infections tested negative, maintaining its record of no Ebola infections. BBC correspondent Jessica Parker provided insights into the direct talks between U.S. Vice President JD Vance and Iran held at a luxury Swiss resort ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Collectively, these reports also note a tragic explosion at Qatar’s main liquefied natural gas processing site in the Ras Laffan industrial zone, resulting in at least 13 deaths and dozens injured. The UN inquiry reiterates its findings that Palestinian children in Gaza have been deliberately targeted, constituting acts of genocide and war crimes ([BBC News](#); [Al](#)



[Jazeera](#)).

## **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Analysis indicates that Iran's Supreme Leader, Khamenei, has cautiously accepted a recent memorandum of understanding with the United States aimed at ending the recent conflict, though internal hardliners remain divided over its implications. Concurrently, Tehran appears to be preparing to bolster support for Hezbollah. In Gaza, progress on the U.S.-backed peace plan remains slow following Hamas meetings in Cairo, where discussions have centered on disarmament and the enclave's future security arrangements. Meanwhile, Ukraine has unveiled reforms intended to address its chronic manpower shortages by establishing clearer terms of service and improved compensation, though questions remain regarding the discharge of long-serving troops and changes to mobilization procedures ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Piracy has surged in the Gulf of Aden, with armed attackers in small skiffs targeting vessels off Yemen's southern coast and surrounding waters near the Horn of Africa at levels unseen since the 2011 peak. Iran has agreed to allow nuclear inspectors access, a development that has been analyzed in recent reports. These events underscore ongoing maritime security challenges and diplomatic efforts in the region ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [FDD](#)).

Further developments include Taiwan's legislative caucus debating increased investment to close its domestic drone development gap, reflecting growing concerns over regional security. The United States faces challenges in efforts to influence Iran's regime transformation. Additionally, Iraqi Prime Minister Ali al-Zaidi met with U.S. envoy Tom Barrack amid militia pressure, focusing on strengthening Baghdad-Washington ties and promoting stability and security cooperation in Iraq ([FDD](#); [FDD](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Taken together, these reports reflect ongoing regional volatility: President Trump announced a two-page memorandum of understanding between the U.S. and Iran intended to end hostilities and reopen the Strait of Hormuz, though skepticism remains regarding its durability. The Israeli Defense Forces confirmed the targeted killing of Ali Mousa Daqduq, a senior Hezbollah commander responsible for establishing Iran-backed militias in Iraq and orchestrating attacks inside Israel ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**



In global developments, Iran's foreign ministry reiterated that no new commitments were made concerning nuclear site inspections following talks in Switzerland. France issued a red alert as an unprecedented heatwave broke records, with Prime Minister Sébastien Lecornu reporting 40 drowning deaths since June 18 as citizens sought relief from the extreme temperatures. The lack of widespread air-conditioning exacerbates the crisis, leading to school closures and heightened public health concerns. Meanwhile, Bangladesh's Prime Minister Tarique Rahman appealed to Malaysia to lift recent restrictions on labor migration, addressing concerns over worker abuse and recruitment fees ([BBC News](#); [France24](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

Additional reports include a financial transaction record (#33871) and observations that U.S. stock traders are increasing positions in volatility index call options amid a summer marked by moderate recession risks, ongoing U.S.-Iran negotiations, and record corporate profits. Hungary's central bank resumed cutting its key interest rate, diverging from global monetary-tightening trends, as inflation slowed following the strengthening of the forint (IMF; [Bloomberg](#)).

Related coverage notes that Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni is considering calling a general election as early as April, months ahead of the legal deadline in 2027. Additionally, Rachel Delacour of Sweep discussed climate policy uncertainty in a recent podcast, while the Premier Hockey Women's League executive highlighted rapid growth driven by surging demand and validated by new investors ([Bloomberg](#); [Bloomberg](#); [Google News](#)).

Taken together, these reports include the sentencing of a former Scottish National Party leader to five years in prison for embezzlement, and a call from the Interparliamentary Assembly on Orthodoxy for enhanced protection of Christians facing persecution worldwide ([Google News](#); [Google News](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Recent health reports emphasize the resurgence of two dangerous viruses, Ebola and hantavirus, both of which can initially present with flu-like symptoms but progress rapidly to severe and often fatal conditions. Hantavirus, commonly associated with rodents, can cause critical heart and lung complications and currently lacks specific treatments or vaccines. Notably, certain hantavirus strains have demonstrated potential for human-to-human transmission. Additionally, ancient DNA analysis reveals that plague was already causing significant mortality 5,500 years ago, predating urbanization and farming, with early strains identified in nearly 40% of individuals from Siberian hunter-gatherer cemeteries. In pharmaceutical advances, researchers at Scripps Research have developed an experimental vaccine designed to prevent fentanyl overdoses by eliciting immune responses against a broad spectrum of fentanyl-related compounds, thereby blocking the drug's effects before reaching the brain ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Another emerging concern is the spread of a deadly tapeworm, *Echinococcus multilocularis*, across the United States, now detected in the Pacific Northwest for the first time. This parasite, linked to a severe, cancer-like disease, was found in 37% of coyotes tested around Puget Sound, indicating a significant expansion of its geographic range and raising public health alarms ([ScienceDaily](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 1.7 earthquake located 34 kilometers south-southwest of Los Ybanez, Texas, at a depth of 3.65 kilometers, recorded on June 23, 2026. Additionally, a magnitude 4.6 earthquake occurred 10 kilometers east of Miyakojima, Japan, at a depth of 35 kilometers on June 22, 2026 ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

Additional reports note a magnitude 6.6 earthquake 133 kilometers east-southeast of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky, Russia, at a depth of 10 kilometers, recorded on June 19, 2026. Furthermore, a green forest fire alert was issued in the United States for a fire that began on June 18, 2026, and continued through June 23, 2026 ([USGS](#); [GDACS](#)).

## **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Archaeological activities continue to yield significant findings in the Middle East. In March 2010, a trial excavation was conducted approximately 100 meters north of the Be'er Sheva North Railroad Station in the Ramot neighborhood of Be'er Sheva (Permit No. A-



5896; map reference 182129-67/574498-530). Similarly, excavations at Ben Gamli'el Street in Yafo (Permit A-8559) have provided detailed location mapping and stratigraphic data ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).

Further reports include the discovery of two well-preserved marble busts from the Roman era found within a Byzantine winepress near the coastal town of Binyamina. Ariel David has also documented the recent publication of a mother-of-pearl seal unearthed at Tel. Detailed plans and sections from the Ben Gamli'el Street excavation in Yafo provide additional context for these findings ([BiblePlaces](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).
