Israel & Jerusalem

The Houthis reported launching missiles and drones targeting what they described as “Saudi military build-ups” in the central Yemeni provinces of Marib and Hadramawt. Lebanese authorities confirmed that one person was killed in Israeli strikes following the first Israeli military fatalities in Lebanon in over a month. Meanwhile, Yinon Levy faces charges of reckless manslaughter related to the July 2025 shooting of Odeh Hathaleen. ([BBC News](#); [BBC News](#); [BBC News](#))

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

North Korea is reportedly sending up to 120 additional ballistic missiles to Ukraine, as Kyiv seeks effective means to neutralize Russian missile launchers. In Sudan, the military’s recapture of the Al Sadarat highway marks its most significant gain against the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) amid the fourth year of civil war. However, the RSF’s increasing reliance on tribal mobilization and the growing use of foreign-backed drone warfare complicate the conflict dynamics. In Afghanistan, three anti-Taliban resistance groups have launched separate operations across Badakhshan province over two weeks, temporarily capturing a district center and attacking Taliban positions in multiple districts, although no direct coordination among these groups has been confirmed. Yemen’s Houthis claimed responsibility for attacks on eight Saudi-linked vessels, as well as strikes on energy facilities and an airport, aiming to enforce their blockade of Saudi Arabia. Riyadh is reportedly exploring diplomatic avenues to de-escalate the conflict while keeping military options on the table. Iraq faces mounting pressure to control militias amid tensions with neighboring countries, the United States, and Iran. Since late February, the Kurdistan Region in northern Iraq has endured nearly 1,000 drone and missile attacks attributed to Iran and its proxies, highlighting the escalating threat in the region. US President Donald Trump announced a 15-point roadmap from the Board of Peace outlining the transfer of governance and security responsibilities in Gaza. The plan conditions phased Israeli withdrawal on verified Hamas disarmament, though the sequencing remains a subject of dispute. ([Long War Journal](#))

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Abelardo de la Espriella, in his maiden speech, vowed an “all-out war” against what he terms “narco-terrorism,” signaling a hardline stance on drug-related violence. The appointment of a former ambassador to Mongolia reflects a shift in diplomatic strategy, though its impact remains limited. Spain’s North African enclave of Ceuta has experienced a surge of over 70,000 migrants, predominantly Moroccans, driven by economic hardship and amplified by social media. Myriam Cherti, Senior Researcher at the Oxford University Centre on Migration, Policy & Society, discussed the implications of this migration surge on Bloomberg. The Senate confirmed Todd Blanche as Attorney General despite initial opposition from several senators concerned about his ties to President Trump. Research indicates that low levels of arginine may enable cancer cells and viruses to evade the immune system by diminishing the production of a critical cellular warning protein. In mouse studies, diets rich in arginine resulted in fewer colon tumors and milder viral infections, suggesting that arginine supplementation could offer a simple yet effective therapeutic approach. Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 1.1 earthquake near Anza, California. Additionally, a magnitude 5.6 earthquake was detected southeast of Easter Island. Another magnitude 5.6 earthquake occurred near Skwentna, Alaska. The seismic event near Easter Island occurred at a depth of 10 kilometers on August 8, 2026, at 11:41 UTC. Middle Eastern Artifacts



The glass assemblage excavated at Oboda spans approximately four centuries of production in the Eastern Mediterranean, from the Early Roman through the early Byzantine periods. The collection includes forms characteristic of Palestine. Excavations in the Negev Highlands town of Oboda also uncovered faunal remains from Roman and Early Byzantine contexts dating to the late third through early fifth centuries CE, indicating that the local economy during both periods relied on these resources. Archaeologists have uncovered a Ramesside-era tomb belonging to an individual named “Paser” on Luxor’s west bank. Additionally, an Egyptian archaeological mission revealed three New Kingdom rock-cut tombs at the Bubasteion Necropolis in Saqqara. In Jerusalem, over one thousand female figurines have been found, but until recently, no molds for these had been discovered in the city.
