Israel & Jerusalem

The initiative to grant Israel observer status in the Central American Parliament advanced with the formation of an Israel Allies Caucus, expected to culminate as early as next month. “The Meira K Show” continues to provide an unfiltered perspective on Israeli society and Middle Eastern politics, addressing stories often overlooked or misrepresented by mainstream media with clarity and candor. Meanwhile, the Trump administration reportedly remains unconcerned by the Israeli prime minister’s rejection of a recent deal, interpreting it as campaign rhetoric ahead of the upcoming general election ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Rabbi Doron Perez expressed gratitude toward the South African president and government for their direct intervention in expediting the return of his son’s remains, noting that without their involvement, the process could have been delayed by months, causing additional pain. Israel’s prime minister affirmed that the military will maintain its presence in Gaza until Hamas is “genuinely” disarmed ([Al Jazeera](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Israel is preparing to undertake large-scale land expropriations in historically Palestinian areas of the West Bank, a move that is expected to have significant implications for the region’s geopolitical landscape ([BBC News](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Jamal Kiyemba, a Ugandan national residing in the United Kingdom, was arrested in northwest Pakistan in 2002 for allegedly attempting to join Al Qaeda in Afghanistan and subsequently detained at the U.S. prison facility in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Released in 2006 and repatriated to Uganda, Kiyemba’s current status remains uncertain. The United States is experiencing diminishing influence in Somalia as growing frustration with Mogadishu threatens critical support for the African Union mission and risks strengthening the Al Shabaab insurgency. In Mali, renewed U.S. airstrikes targeting the jihadist group JNIM raise concerns about the effectiveness of air power alone without accompanying



ground operations or political reforms. Meanwhile, North Korea is reportedly dispatching up to 120 additional ballistic missiles to Ukraine, as the embattled nation seeks ways to neutralize Russian missile launchers ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

The Sudanese military's recapture of the Al Sadarat highway represents its most significant achievement against the Rapid Support Forces in the fourth year of the Sudanese civil war. However, the RSF's shift toward tribal mobilization and the increasing use of foreign-backed drone warfare indicate a strategic adaptation in the conflict's dynamics ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

The United States faces an escalating threat from an axis of aggressors, with resistance organizations in Afghanistan expanding their operations into southern regions, historically focused in the north. This development signals a broadening of opposition efforts against the Taliban regime ([FDD](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Yemen's Houthi movement claimed responsibility for attacks on eight Saudi-linked vessels, as well as on energy facilities and an airport, aiming to enforce its blockade of Saudi Arabia. Riyadh is reportedly pursuing diplomatic avenues to de-escalate the conflict, while maintaining military options if necessary. Iraq is under increasing pressure to control militias amid tensions with neighboring countries, the United States, and Iran. Since late February, the Kurdistan Region in northern Iraq has endured nearly 1,000 drone and missile attacks attributed to Iran and its proxies, highlighting the escalating threat in the area ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

An ex-president has been convicted of war crimes and crimes against humanity committed during the country's civil war, marking a significant development in international justice. Despite a recent series of attacks, a critical oil supply route involving shuttle transits through the Strait of Hormuz continues to operate, maintaining the flow of energy from the Middle East ([BBC News](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 2.7 earthquake near Pinnacles, California, and a magnitude 7.4 earthquake near San José del Palmar, Colombia. Additionally, a magnitude 6.3 earthquake occurred near Sarangani, Philippines. In Indonesia, a magnitude 4.6 earthquake at a depth of approximately 171 kilometers was reported on August 11, 2026, with few people affected within a 100-kilometer radius ([USGS](https://www.usgs.gov); [USGS](https://www.usgs.gov); [USGS](https://www.usgs.gov); [GDACS](https://www.gdacs.org)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

The glass assemblage uncovered at Oboda spans roughly four centuries of production in the Eastern Mediterranean, ranging from the Early Roman to the early Byzantine periods. The collection includes forms characteristic of Palestine. Excavations in the Negev Highlands town of Oboda also revealed faunal remains from Roman and Early Byzantine contexts dated to the late third through early fifth centuries CE.
