



Global Watch Daily – August 20, 2026

Israel & Jerusalem

The Anti-Defamation League emphasized the importance of teaching about the Holocaust within the broader context of Jewish experiences with antisemitism, stating that it is impactful on its own and does not require persuasion by appealing to personal relevance. The United Kingdom's foreign secretary condemned a recent decision as "an unacceptable and destructive act," while Australia's foreign minister summoned the Israeli ambassador to express displeasure over the "insulting" Zomi Frankcom ruling ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#); [BBC News](#)).

The Israeli Supreme Court recently suspended budget allocations approved by the Knesset Finance Committee, leaving the Religious Services Ministry without legally authorized funding to operate the Tomb of the Patriarchs. Meanwhile, the U.S. ambassador to Israel criticized Hamas for failing to surrender any weapons as required by the Board of Peace's Gaza disarmament plan. A five-year-old Palestinian girl initially survived an attack and pleaded for help, but her body was later recovered alongside those of six relatives ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Israeli airstrikes targeted Syria's Abu al Duhur military airbase overnight between August 17 and 18, underscoring escalating tensions between Israel and Turkey amid Ankara's expanding involvement in Syria. Syria condemned the strikes, while the United States continued diplomatic efforts to de-escalate the situation. Concurrently, Russia is reportedly supplying Iran with explosives, drone components, and other military equipment, enabling Tehran to replenish its arsenals in preparation for future conflicts with the United States and Israel. Following Israel's rejection of the Board of Peace's initial disarmament plan, U.S. Special Envoy Jared Kushner and Board of Peace officials engaged in talks with Hamas



and Israel, leading Washington to adjust its position to prioritize Hamas's disarmament. Meanwhile, Hamas and other Palestinian terrorist groups remain active ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Iran's drone attack on August 17 targeted the office of Kurdistan Regional Government Prime Minister Masrour Barzani, drawing widespread international condemnation. This strike occurred amid growing pressure on Baghdad to assert control over Iranian-backed militias and their weapons. For the first time since March, Israeli jets conducted deep strikes inside Syria on August 18, focusing on the Abu Duhur airbase in Idlib governorate, approximately 70 kilometers south of the Turkish border. These actions signal Israel's efforts to draw a firm line against Turkey's military activities in Syria ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [FDD](#)).

A wargame conducted fifteen years ago simulated a simultaneous conflict with Russia and China, revealing significant challenges for the U.S. military that remain relevant today, especially in light of the ongoing conflict with Iran. The Chatham House 2026 Prize was awarded to the women of Afghanistan, recognizing their significant contributions to improving international relations ([FDD](#); [Chatham House](#)).

Generation Jihad analysts Bill Roggio and Edmund Fitton-Brown, a former United Nations Monitoring Team coordinator, examined the latest United Nations 1267 report detailing the global status of the Islamic State, Al Qaeda, and affiliated groups. The Israel Defense Forces reported that a Hezbollah explosive drone seriously wounded three Israeli soldiers on August 15 at Ali al Taher Ridge. Israel retaliated with strikes that killed senior commanders of the Radwan and Badr factions. Hezbollah has not claimed responsibility, while Lebanese sources allege Israeli involvement in other incidents ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Jewel Howard-Taylor was arrested at Liberia's international airport and has not publicly addressed the allegations against her. Anxiety surrounding artificial intelligence permeates various sectors, from workers concerned about job security to investors warning of a potential financial bubble. AI has also become a significant topic within Federal Reserve policy discussions. Pestilence & Global Health

Research indicates that COVID-19 can reactivate dormant viruses within the body, including Epstein-Barr virus, cytomegalovirus, and several herpes viruses. A previously poorly understood viral family has been strongly linked to long COVID and persistent disability, offering important insights into why some patients experience prolonged symptoms. Additionally, scientists have discovered a promising method to potentially eliminate HIV shortly after infection using a one-time combination of three therapies. In newborn nonhuman primates treated within three days of exposure, this regimen—comprising standard antiretroviral drugs, broadly neutralizing antibodies, and other agents—showed significant efficacy ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 1.4 earthquake near Anza, California, and a magnitude 5.2 earthquake near Dunhuang, China ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

A magnitude 7.7 earthquake struck near Ende, Indonesia, as recorded by USGS. Additionally, a green forest fire alert was issued in the Democratic Republic of Congo ([USGS](#); [GDACS](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

In February 1998, a test excavation took place in the village of Kisra (Permit No. A-2818/1998, map reference 2280-90/7620-30) prior to the installation of a sewage line. Earlier, in June 1997, a salvage excavation was conducted in Lot 69, Neighborhood 9, at Caesarea (Permit No. A-2679/1997; map reference 18940-9160/70780-1115) ahead of construction work. Archaeologists uncovered a rock-cut burial cave within the kurkar formation ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).

Jerusalem Seminary announced the completion of its merger with the University of the Holy Land, which will continue under the Jerusalem Seminary name. Archaeologists recently uncovered a complete bath complex in Port Said that was used for centuries. Plans are underway to restore the ceremonial gateway to the ancient city of Parseh (Persepolis). Additionally, discussions on the concept of zero continue to emerge in archaeological and historical contexts ([BiblePlaces](#); [BiblePlaces](#)).
