Israel & Jerusalem

Zamir has placed the headquarters of an additional active-duty division on heightened readiness and ordered units and battalions to be prepared for immediate activation in the sector. Razek Sahil Suleiman Abu Shahma infiltrated the Israeli military's Re'im base near Gaza. A Jerusalem court ruled that the Jewish attacker involved in the assault on a nun was experiencing a psychotic episode, an incident that sparked widespread outrage ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

The head of the Yashar Party expressed opposition to the establishment of a Palestinian state, describing it as “delusional” thinking following the October 7 massacre. Engaging in political races carries calculated risks, but confronting a leading candidate who is anti-Israel and anti-Jewish is generally considered necessary. Israel has shut down the last of the Palestinian refugee agency's facilities in the city sector, following the passage of a law prohibiting its operations ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Zvi Sukkot's actions have drawn widespread condemnation, including a response from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu ([BBC News](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces announced their dissolution as the United States seeks to advance security talks between Syria and Israel. The US has rescinded Syria's designation as a state sponsor of terrorism. The Taliban achieved notable victories with the surrender of dissident commander Juma Khan Fateh and the death of senior National Resistance Front commander Hasib Panjshiri, as Afghanistan's armed resistance attempts to build momentum despite ongoing challenges ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Jessica Bowie was arrested on August 19, accused of plotting to bomb the New York State Capitol. This marks the fifth Islamic State-linked terrorism case or incident in the United States this year. President Donald Trump has employed various strategies, from



negotiations to military force, to counter Tehran's nuclear, missile, and regional ambitions, ultimately settling on economic pressure. Lebanon ordered Iran's ambassador-designate out in March; however, Mohammad Reza Sheibani remains in Beirut with legal residence extended for at least six more months despite political rejection ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [FDD](#)).

Venezuela continues to face a difficult recovery from the twin earthquakes of June 24, with rising death tolls and extensive infrastructure damage exacerbating the strain on its fragile economy. Nonetheless, Caracas's oil sector has seen a surge in sales, offering some economic relief ([Long War Journal](#)).

Five years after Kabul's fall, Afghanistan's armed resistance persists and continues to expand despite lacking territorial sanctuary, overt state sponsorship, or significant international support. While not an existential threat to Taliban rule, its persistence presents ongoing challenges. Twenty-five years after 9/11, analysts remain divided on whether Al Qaeda is a spent force or a resurgent threat. Bill Roggio and Will Selber discuss these issues with Graeme Wood, staff writer at The Atlantic, unpacking the group's uncertain legacy ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Iran's top diplomat met with his Qatari counterpart in Tehran to discuss the strategic Strait of Hormuz amid a US naval blockade that is constricting Iran's oil exports during a period of domestic fuel shortages. Nine years after the Rohingya genocide, refugees remain displaced and continue to seek justice, though hope endures. European Central Bank officials debated the potential need for a "mildly restrictive" monetary policy to ensure inflation returns to the 2% target, reflecting ongoing concerns about sovereign debt and economic stability ([France24](#); [The Diplomat](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

A study involving over 500,000 older adults found that those who received the Shingrix shingles vaccine were 24% less likely to be diagnosed with dementia over four years. Researchers estimate this could prevent approximately one dementia case for every 17 vaccinated individuals. In Australia, backyard bird feeders have become potential hotspots for the spread of H5N1 avian influenza, as the outbreak brings together species that rarely interact naturally. Experts recommend ceasing bird feeding or, if feeding continues, reducing food amounts, avoiding hand-feeding, and maintaining rigorous cleaning to mitigate risks. Artificial intelligence has shown promise in predicting vaccine responsiveness by analyzing antibody patterns in more than 4,000 people, identifying markers of “immune readiness” that distinguish strong responders from weak ones ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Research indicates that COVID-19 can reactivate dormant viruses within the body, including Epstein-Barr virus, cytomegalovirus, and several herpes viruses. One poorly understood viral family has been strongly associated with long COVID and lasting disability, offering a potentially important clue to why some patients experience prolonged symptoms ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 1.5 earthquake near Cloverdale, California. Additionally, a magnitude 4.9 earthquake occurred near the Indian Ocean Triple Junction. No casualties were reported within 100 kilometers of the latter event. A green forest fire notification was issued for the Democratic Republic of Congo ([USGS](#); [USGS](#); [GDACS](#); [GDACS](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Visitors to biblical sites will benefit from well-regarded guidebooks such as Jerome Murphy-O'Connor's *The Holy Land* and Clyde E. Fant and Mitchell G. Reddish's *A Guide*. Excavations continue to reveal significant discoveries, including a Roman-era street at Troy. On a Turkish hillside overlooking olive-covered slopes near Izmir lies a cave long known to locals as the place where Homer composed *The Odyssey* ([BiblePlaces](#); [BiblePlaces](#)).

In February 2001, salvage excavations were conducted at Bet Ha-Gaddi (Permit No. A-3370/2001; map ref. 16334/59220) following damage caused by infrastructure works.
