



Global Watch Daily – September 6, 2026

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A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

Israel & Jerusalem

Israeli security forces apprehended a 10-member Hamas terror cell during an operation near Nablus (Shechem). The American Committee for Overseas Missions (ACOM) criticized Prime Minister Sánchez, stating he does not represent the Iberian nation, and suggested that a new government could swiftly improve relations with Israel. Meanwhile, the Israeli-American Council launched a petition urging concert organizers to remove a rapper from a tour after his on-stage calls to “Free Palestine” ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [JNS](#)).

Two Palestinian teenagers, Omar al-Naasan and Khalil Abu Alia, were shot dead when Israeli settlers and soldiers entered a village in the occupied West Bank, according to Al Jazeera ([BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Israeli special operations forces captured a senior Hamas security official during a September 1 raid in the Katiba area of western Gaza City. This operation occurred amid the US-backed Board of Peace’s stabilization plan and Hamas disarmament agreement, which had led Israel to reduce its strikes. The United States is reportedly cutting funding for the Kurdistan Regional Government’s Peshmerga forces as Washington prepares to withdraw troops from Iraq, while Iran intensifies drone and missile attacks against the Kurdistan Region. President Donald Trump announced on August 28 a sweeping oil agreement with Venezuela, granting American interests majority control over more than 65 billion barrels of proven reserves; this is part of a 25-year strategy to expand US energy influence ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Edmund Fitton-Brown, senior fellow at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies and former coordinator of the United Nations Monitoring Team, discussed with Colin Smith, the current coordinator, the latest 1267 report detailing the status of Al Qaeda, the Islamic State, and their affiliates. Amid ongoing Russian sabotage efforts across Europe, NATO announced that Germany successfully completed a test launch of an Israeli-made ballistic



missile in the North Atlantic, following a related test the previous day. Berlin and Jerusalem are expanding naval cooperation in response to threats from Russia and Iran. In Europe, particularly France, there is a growing consensus that the United States has pursued a harsh strategy toward Iran, with some analysts suggesting that while America has not yet prevailed, Iran may be losing ground ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [FDD](#)).

Political tensions in Turkey are mounting as President Erdoğan faces growing opposition ahead of upcoming elections. Analysts at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies explore the potential outcomes of this crisis. In Yemen, Abu Hudhayfah al Ansari, the Islamic State's official spokesman for three years, was reportedly killed during a joint Saudi-Yemeni special forces raid in Hadhramaut Governorate. The Islamic State has not yet confirmed his status ([FDD](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Iraq's efforts to bring Iranian-backed militias under state control face new challenges as Kataib Sayyid al Shuhada has set conditions for disarmament. This debate unfolds amid continued US pressure on Baghdad and growing concerns over regional stability. Meanwhile, China, Russia, Iran, and North Korea have intensified their cooperation, bolstering Russian aggression in Ukraine and increasing Iran's resilience and lethality ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Japan is considering whether it can "normalize" relations amid shifting regional dynamics. The Trump administration has intensified economic pressure on Iran through sanctions and a naval blockade, with Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent noting that Tehran has approximately 30 million barrels of crude oil remaining for potential Chinese buyers. Turkey lowered its gross domestic product growth forecast for 2027 to 4.2 percent, reflecting the delicate balance between maintaining price stability and fostering growth as the repercussions of the Iran conflict continue and elections approach ([The Diplomat](#); [Bloomberg](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

Additional analysis on the ongoing tensions in the Persian Gulf highlights Iran's targeting of tankers in the Strait of Hormuz, while US envoys have arrived in Kyiv to discuss security matters ([Bloomberg](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health



The compound pterostilbene has been shown to reduce abnormal fat accumulation in cultured mouse muscle cells by enhancing fat breakdown. A year-long study comparing omega-3 supplements and low-dose aspirin found both treatments matched the effectiveness of antibiotics in patients with severe gum disease, with approximately 58% of participants reaching treatment goals. This unexpected finding may offer alternative therapies that reduce antibiotic reliance. Additionally, older adults vaccinated with the Shingrix shingles vaccine were 24% less likely to develop dementia over four years in a study involving over 500,000 individuals, suggesting that roughly one dementia case could be prevented for every 17 vaccinated people ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Australia's ongoing H5N1 bird flu outbreak is spreading as backyard bird feeders inadvertently bring together species that rarely interact naturally, creating hotspots for transmission. Experts recommend ceasing bird feeding as the safest measure, while smaller food quantities, avoiding hand-feeding, and thorough cleaning can mitigate risks ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 2.5 earthquake near Kokhanok, Alaska, and a magnitude 5.2 earthquake near the southern East Pacific Rise. The latter event occurred at a depth of 10 kilometers with no reported impact on populations within 100 kilometers ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

A magnitude 3.7 earthquake was also recorded near Castle Rock, Washington. The Green earthquake alert system classified the 5.2 magnitude event at the East Pacific Rise as low risk, with no people affected within 100 kilometers ([USGS](#); [GDACS](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Recent archaeological reports include a location map and detailed plans and sections of a hewn installation discovered in the region ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).

A team led by Israeli researcher Yoav Vaknin has developed a method to distinguish genuine clay artifacts from modern forgeries by analyzing faint magnetic signals embedded in the objects during firing thousands of years ago. This technique was demonstrated alongside 3D models of a stone pile, providing new tools for artifact authentication ([BiblePlaces](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).
