Israel & Jerusalem

Jeannette Sánchez-Palacios emphasized the firm stance against hate and hateful acts, stating the importance of clearly defining antisemitism to effectively counter it ([JNS](#)). Meanwhile, BBC Verify traced the location of a Houthi video that shows the wreckage of an F-15 fighter jet, which the Houthis claim to have shot down ([BBC News](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Recent agreements signal shifts in regional security dynamics. David Daoud, a senior fellow at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies, discussed Lina Khatib's July visit to southern Lebanon with her at Chatham House, highlighting why the 2006 war failed to establish the Lebanese Armed Forces' control over the border. Israeli forces advanced from the outskirts of Ali al Taher Ridge into Hezbollah's underground network, with Hezbollah repeatedly revising its narrative of success—from denying Israeli entry to framing the loss as an attritional victory ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Syria's military is rebuilding rapidly, but its organizational structure and reliance on foreign powers may constrain Damascus's ability to align with U.S. security objectives. Cooperation from Turkey and Russia carries conditions that could limit Syria's potential as a strategic partner. The Sinjar Resistance Units, a Yazidi armed group in northern Iraq, agreed to disarm and integrate into Iraqi security forces, according to the Iraqi Prime Minister's Office on September 11. Following the demolition of Hezbollah's underground complex at Ali al Taher, the Israel Defense Forces revealed new details about their three-month operation on September 16 ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [FDD](#)).

Two major reports on the conflict with Iran this month suggest that the Islamic Republic has largely evaded U.S. containment efforts, frustrating American strategies. Meanwhile, Chatham House welcomed the 2026-2027 cohort to its Molchanov Sustainability Internship Programme, which offers a six-month placement for emerging experts ([FDD](#); [Chatham](#)



[House](#)).

Israel assesses that the Lebanese Armed Forces are coordinating with Hezbollah in pilot zones designed to disarm non-state actors. This assessment is supported by years of evidence showing that such coordination has led to negotiated access, handovers, and seizures. This development occurs amid mounting pressure on Baghdad over militia activities and ongoing Iranian strikes targeting Kurdish opposition groups based in Iraq ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

An attack on Saudi Arabia's East-West pipeline has disrupted a vital transit route circumventing the Strait of Hormuz, threatening crude oil deliveries to Europe and intensifying pressure on already strained diesel markets. On Bloomberg This Weekend, Chris Kennedy, Bloomberg Economics Statecraft Lead, analyzed the complex oil market dynamics and the uncertain outlook. Meanwhile, European Central Bank Governing Council member Yannis Stournaras cautioned that while inflation risks remain elevated, the ECB should avoid hasty policy actions ([Bloomberg](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

AI Dominion, Deception & the Antichrist System

Though Europe has measures that address how consumers might encounter artificial intelligence, technology will impact them if the worst scenarios bear Europe's dilemma over artificial intelligence was rendered in stark terms this week. The head of the continent's central bank, Christine Lagarde, said Europeans have two options: shun the technology and lose out on growth; or embrace it and become dependent on tools developed by the US and China. Indonesia's Ministry of Home Affairs has launched an Early Market Engagement process to guide the procurement of a next-generation Automated Biometric Identification System. The Directorate General of Population and Civil Registration (Ditjen Dukcapil) manages the



initiative, with support from the World Bank under the \$250 million ID for Inclusive Service Delivery and Digital Transformation in Indonesia project. Nepalese authorities have adopted an artificial intelligence-powered facial recognition system to complement DNA analysis efforts aimed at accelerating the identification of dead persons found after devastating floods hit parts of the country last month. U.S. The question of how to govern artificial intelligence agents has been top of mind for identity providers lately, prompting a wave of solutions. Now, i Proov has entered the mix by publishing a new “experimental procedural specification for managing artificial intelligence Agents” (biometricupdate.com).

Pestilence & Global Health

Ancient DNA analysis reveals that plague affected hunter-gatherer populations in Siberia 5,500 years ago, predating urban centers and flea-driven epidemics. These prehistoric strains may have been particularly virulent due to a genetic factor that triggered severe immune responses ([ScienceDaily](https://www.sciencedaily.com)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 1.0 earthquake near The Geysers in California and a magnitude 4.8 earthquake near Mongar, Bhutan ([USGS](https://www.usgs.gov); [USGS](https://www.usgs.gov)).

Additionally, USGS reported a magnitude 6.5 earthquake near Nikolski, Alaska. Indonesia has issued a green forest fire notification, indicating ongoing wildfire activity ([USGS](https://www.usgs.gov); [GDACS](https://www.gdacs.org)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Published by the Survey of Israel and Donald T. Ariel on October 31, 2002, recent studies have highlighted archaeological findings in the region ([Israel Antiquities Authority](https://www.israelantiquitiesauthority.org); [Israel Antiquities Authority](https://www.israelantiquitiesauthority.org)).

Excavations at the agora in Smyrna uncovered three rooms adorned with wall paintings and mosaics. For nearly 180 years, archaeological research at Nimrud in northern Iraq has concentrated on palaces and temples.
