



Global Watch Daily – September 21, 2026

Israel & Jerusalem

The upcoming Feast of the Tabernacles event in Jerusalem will also emphasize ongoing efforts to assist Israeli communities along the Gaza border in recovering and rebuilding their homes and villages following the October 7 attacks. The festival founder expressed heightened vigilance after anti-Israel activists targeted the event in 2025. Meanwhile, fighting along Yemen's west coast has forced thousands to flee by boat across the Bab al-Mandab Strait, underscoring regional instability ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

On Saturday, a reported strike on a fuel depot at Riyadh airport caused significant delays, as Saudi Arabia announced it had intercepted a ballistic missile targeting the capital. The incident highlights ongoing tensions in the region ([BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Recent analyses reveal that Israeli forces advanced from the outskirts of Ali al Taher Ridge into Hezbollah's underground network, prompting the group to repeatedly revise its narrative of success—from denying Israeli entry to framing the loss as an attritional victory. Discussions on the 2006 Lebanon war highlight why the Lebanese Armed Forces have not fully assumed control of the border region, with Hezbollah maintaining significant influence ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Syria's military under the post-Assad regime is undergoing rapid rebuilding; however, its structural weaknesses and reliance on foreign powers may limit Damascus's capacity to support U.S. security objectives. Cooperation with Turkey and Russia carries potential risks that could undermine Syria's role as a future partner. In northern Iraq, the Sinjar Resistance Units, a Yazidi armed group, agreed to disarm and integrate into Iraqi security forces, marking a significant development in regional stabilization efforts. The Israel Defense Forces disclosed new details about their three-month operation demolishing Hezbollah's underground complex at Ali al Taher in southern Lebanon ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#); [FDD](#)).



Two major reports on the conflict with Iran this month suggest that the Islamic Republic has largely evaded U.S. containment efforts, frustrating American attempts to limit Tehran's regional influence ([FDD](#)).

Chatham House announced the arrival of the 2026-2027 cohort for its Molchanov Sustainability Internship Programme, offering a six-month placement to provide valuable learning experiences. Israel reportedly assesses that the Lebanese military is coordinating with Hezbollah in pilot zones aimed at disarming non-state actors. This assessment aligns with years of evidence and recent developments since 2024, including negotiated access, handovers, and seizures of weapons and positions ([Chatham House](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Ukraine launched over 1,000 drones against Russia, including hundreds targeting Moscow, marking the largest drone assault of the war to date. This offensive coincided with the final day of Russia's tightly controlled parliamentary elections, overseen by President Vladimir Putin. Meanwhile, U.S. equity futures rose as oil prices declined, buoyed by optimism surrounding an upcoming summit between U.S. President Donald Trump and China's Xi Jinping. In Germany, Chancellor Friedrich Merz reaffirmed his commitment to advancing his reform agenda despite his Christian Democratic Union suffering a historic defeat in a regional parliament election, the first such loss since World War II ([France24](#); [Bloomberg](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

AI Dominion, Deception & the Antichrist System

Indonesia's Ministry of Home Affairs has launched an Early Market Engagement process to guide the procurement of a next-generation Automated Biometric Identification System. The Directorate General of Population and Civil Registration (Ditjen Dukcapil) manages the initiative, with support from the World Bank under the \$250 million ID for Inclusive Service Delivery and Digital Transformation in Indonesia project. Nepalese authorities have adopted an artificial intelligence-powered facial recognition system to complement DNA analysis efforts aimed at accelerating the identification of dead persons found after devastating floods hit parts of the country last month. U.S. The question of how to govern artificial intelligence agents has been top of mind for identity providers lately, prompting a wave of solutions. Now, i Proov has entered the mix by publishing a new "experimental procedural specification for managing artificial intelligence Agents," according to a release

Pestilence & Global Health

Researchers have developed a refined method to date ancient plague genomes more precisely, linking many to prehistoric outbreaks. A growing outbreak of Bundibugyo virus, a lesser-known relative of Ebola, demonstrates how such pathogens can pose major threats when diagnostic and treatment options are limited. Experts caution that focusing preparedness solely on familiar pathogens risks leaving the world vulnerable to rare but deadly viruses that may suddenly reemerge. Ancient DNA evidence shows that plague affected hunter-gatherer populations in Siberia 5,500 years ago, well before the rise of cities and flea-driven epidemics. These prehistoric strains may have been particularly virulent due to a genetic factor that provoked severe immune reactions ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 0.9 earthquake near Little Lake, California, and a magnitude 5.2 earthquake near Mejillones, Chile. Additionally, a magnitude 6.4 earthquake occurred near Kainantu, Papua New Guinea. A green alert was issued for a magnitude 5.2 earthquake off the coast of northern Chile at a depth of 10 kilometers on September 21, 2026, at 11:48 UTC; no casualties were reported within 100 kilometers of the epicenter ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Published by the Survey of Israel and Donald T. Ariel in 2002, recent archaeological reports provide important insights into the region's ancient history ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).

Excavations in Sector A of the Bubasteum necropolis in Saqqara uncovered the tomb of an ancient Egyptian royal chamberlain during its inaugural season. The Pyramid of Menkaure has been closed to visitors following recent developments. A final report on Italian excavations at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher revealed a clear sequence of use—from stone quarry to farmland, then cemetery, and finally church. Access to the full report requires a subscription. Authorities have also utilized these findings to inform ongoing
