Israel & Jerusalem

The historical ties between Israeli tourists and the Thai Jewish community run deep, reflecting longstanding cultural interconnections. Mamdani expressed to CNN his conviction that Netanyahu should be arrested during his forthcoming visit to New York. Meanwhile, the United Kingdom has agreed to provide air-to-air refueling support for defensive operations at Saudi Arabia's request, signaling increased military cooperation in the region ([JNS](#); [JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

The G7 has issued a strong condemnation of Houthi attacks on Saudi Arabia, emphasizing that the intensifying conflict in Yemen threatens global energy security. In the United States, a Jewish civic organization has endorsed George Latimer and Mike Lawler for Congress and Shelley Mayer for state Senate, highlighting their records on supporting Israel, combating antisemitism, and fostering bipartisan cooperation. Israel has also warned travelers against bringing four specific species into the country, underscoring the importance of biosecurity measures to protect local agriculture from invasive pests ([BBC News](#); [JNS](#); [JNS](#)).

BBC correspondent Frank Gardner reports on individuals fleeing the war in Yemen by crossing the Red Sea to Djibouti. The ongoing fighting on Yemen's west coast has forced thousands to escape via boat across the Bab al-Mandab Strait, highlighting the humanitarian crisis unfolding in the region ([BBC News](#); [BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The Pakistani Air Force launched airstrikes in eastern Afghanistan targeting terrorist training camps in retaliation for a complex suicide attack in western Pakistan. The Taliban denied responsibility for the attack and vowed an "appropriate response" to Pakistan's military actions. Meanwhile, discussions continue regarding security arrangements in Lebanon; David Daoud, a senior fellow at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies, interviewed Lina Khatib of Chatham House about her July visit to southern Lebanon and



the enduring challenges since the 2006 war, particularly the Lebanese Armed Forces' limited control over the border region ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Israeli forces advanced from the outskirts of Ali al Taher Ridge into its underground network, while Hezbollah repeatedly adjusted its narrative regarding the battle's outcome—initially denying Israeli entry, then framing the loss as an attritional success. This reframing reflects Hezbollah's strategic communication efforts amid Israeli military progress ([Long War Journal](#)).

Chatham House has welcomed the 2026-2027 cohort for the Molchanov Sustainability Internship Programme, which provides invaluable six-month placements. Meanwhile, Syria's post-Assad military is undergoing rapid rebuilding; however, its organizational structure and reliance on foreign powers such as Turkey and Russia could constrain Damascus's ability to serve U.S. security interests. Security cooperation with these countries may come with conditions that limit Syria's potential as a future partner in regional stability ([Chatham House](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Brazil's central bank has adopted a cautious stance, indicating that the extent of monetary easing will depend on forthcoming economic data as the country approaches a highly uncertain presidential election. In Europe, ASML Holding NV, the continent's most valuable company, announced it will not sell any of its chipmaking machines in Europe. This decision raises concerns that Europe risks falling behind the United States, China, and India, which are heavily investing in domestic semiconductor industries to secure technological sovereignty ([Bloomberg](#); [Bloomberg](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

New research indicates that long COVID may damage dopamine-releasing neurons in the brain, which could explain symptoms such as persistent fatigue, reduced motivation, slowed movement, and memory difficulties. This finding opens avenues for treatments targeting the brain's dopamine system. Additionally, scientists have developed a more precise method for dating ancient plague genomes, linking many outbreaks to historical events. Meanwhile, a growing outbreak of Bundibugyo virus, a lesser-known relative of Ebola, demonstrates how rare pathogens can pose significant threats when diagnosis and treatment are limited. Experts caution that focusing solely on familiar diseases may leave the world vulnerable to sudden reemergence of deadly viruses ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#) ; [ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

The United States Geological Survey recorded a magnitude 4.7 earthquake near La Gomera, Guatemala, and a magnitude 5.1 earthquake near Uken, Japan, underscoring ongoing seismic activity in these regions ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

A magnitude 6.5 earthquake struck near Nikolski, Alaska, United States, while Indonesia issued a green forest fire notification, highlighting environmental and geological challenges in these areas ([USGS](#); [GDACS](#)).

Archaeologists discovered the tomb of an ancient Egyptian royal chamberlain in Sector A of the Bubasteum necropolis in Saqqara during its inaugural excavation season. The Pyramid of Menkaure has been closed to visitors following recent developments. A final report on Italian excavations in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher outlines a clear historical sequence from stone quarry to farmland, then cemetery, and finally church.
