Global Watch Daily – November 28, 2025

Israel & Jerusalem

Israeli police recently shut down a construction site in northern Israel after uncovering a hidden weapons cache, signaling ongoing security concerns within the region ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, political tensions continue as the ousted chair of the Knesset defense panel criticized the government for advancing policies that he described as the “exact opposite” of a conscription law, highlighting internal debates over military service and national defense ([Times of Israel](#)).

In a significant cultural and religious event, Levites have returned to sing on the Temple Mount for the first time since the destruction of the ancient temples, marking a historic moment in Jewish worship and heritage ([Israel365 News](#)). At the same time, Israel is testing its readiness for a potential mass aliyah amid rising antisemitism worldwide, preparing infrastructure and social systems to absorb an influx of Jewish immigrants ([Israel365 News](#)).

Legislative developments include progress on a bill to repeal Jordanian-era restrictions on land purchases by Jews in Judea and Samaria. This move could impact settlement policies and regional dynamics ([Israel365 News](#)). Diplomatic efforts continue as Lebanon’s Foreign Minister stated that in ongoing negotiations with Israel, “nothing is taboo,” indicating a willingness to discuss a broad range of issues between the two countries ([JNS](#)).

International relations were further highlighted by Germany’s Chancellor candidate Friedrich Merz planning a visit to Israel to meet with Prime Minister Netanyahu, underscoring Germany’s ongoing strategic interest in the region ([Al-Monitor](#)). The United Nations condemned recent killings in the West Bank, described as “brazen,” reflecting continuing international concern over the Israeli-Palestinian conflict ([Al-Monitor](#)).

Israeli military operations remain active, with Israeli forces killing 13 individuals in a southern Syria operation, marking the deadliest Israeli raid in the area for months ([Al-Monitor](#)), ([BBC](#)). In the West Bank, Israeli troops killed two Palestinians after the individuals



appeared to surrender, an incident that has drawn international attention ([BBC](#)). Additionally, a Palestinian-American teenager was released after nine months in Israeli detention, highlighting ongoing issues related to arrests and detentions in the region ([BBC](#)).

Security alerts continue as the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) issued an evacuation order for Tehran ahead of planned strikes, indicating heightened tensions with Iran ([Jerusalem Post](#)). The Defense Ministry is also conducting a military exercise on Highway 35, preparing for potential security scenarios ([Jerusalem Post](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The security situation in the Middle East remains volatile, with Palestinian Islamic Jihad reportedly rebuilding its presence in Syria, suggesting a resurgence of militant activity in the area ([Long War Journal](#)). In Lebanon, Hezbollah faces leadership changes following the assassination of its top military commander, with analyses focusing on likely candidates to replace him and the implications for the group's future operations ([Long War Journal](#)), ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)).

In Gaza, Hamas handed over the body of a hostage as the IDF continues operations against terror cells in Rafah, reflecting ongoing conflict and humanitarian concerns in the region ([Long War Journal](#)).

On the diplomatic and military cooperation front, Greece is hosting joint military exercises with Israel, Cyprus, and the United Arab Emirates, signaling strengthened alliances and regional security partnerships ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)).

In a related geopolitical development, the U.S. revoked the visa of a former South African Foreign Minister. This move may affect international relations and diplomatic engagements ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)).

Apostasy & Religious Developments

Religious and cultural trends continue to evolve, with notable developments including Pope Leo's first speech in Turkey, where he urged President Erdogan to act as a broker for peace in the region, emphasizing the importance of reconciliation and dialogue ([Religion News](#)). The Pope is also scheduled to mark Christian unity at the historic site in Turkey where the Nicene Creed originated, highlighting ecumenical efforts ([France24](#)).



Within evangelical circles, discussions continue around cultural phenomena such as fairies and UFOs, as explored by Ross Douthat in a recent guide, reflecting ongoing engagement with contemporary spiritual and cultural questions ([Religion News](#)). Meanwhile, Christianity Today introduced its new president, signaling leadership transitions within influential Christian organizations ([Christianity Today](#)).

Positive stories of faith and courage have also emerged, including a Chinese pastor released after 12 years in prison, a teenager who saved strangers during a flood, and reflections on the transformative power of thanksgiving in the Christian life ([International Christian Concern](#)), ([Crosswalk](#)), ([The Gospel Coalition](#)).

Biotechnology & Genetic Engineering

Recent scientific studies reveal that polluted air can negate the health benefits of exercise, underscoring environmental impacts on human well-being ([ScienceDaily](#)). Research into mitochondrial DNA damage has identified it as a potential missing link in various diseases, opening new avenues for medical investigation ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Advancements in biotechnology include the development of ultrasensitive electrochemical biosensors based on MXene quantum dots for detecting prostate cancer biomarkers, representing progress in early diagnosis technology ([Nature](#)). Additionally, novel gene-editing strategies using chimeric I-TevI/CRISPR editors have been profiled for domain-specific activity, thereby enhancing precision in genetic engineering ([Nature](#)).

On the public health front, global measles vaccination rates have nearly returned to pre-pandemic levels, according to a recent World Health Organization report, indicating progress in infectious disease control ([STAT News](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

New 3D imaging has unveiled the hidden structure of the yellow fever virus, providing insights that may aid in the development of more effective treatments and vaccines ([ScienceDaily](#)). Researchers have also discovered a tiny ancient virus that could hold secrets useful in combating antibiotic-resistant superbugs, a growing global health threat ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Studies on Long COVID have identified strange microscopic structures in the blood of affected patients, potentially advancing understanding of the condition's pathology ([ScienceDaily](#)). Meanwhile, widespread avian influenza outbreaks in birds have increased



the risk of human exposure, prompting public health vigilance in Europe ([ECDC](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Seismic activity was recorded in various locations around the world on November 28, 2025, including a magnitude 1.4 earthquake north of Stanton, Texas, and more minor tremors near Bridgeport and Idyllwild, California, reflecting ongoing tectonic movements ([USGS](#)), ([USGS](#)), ([USGS](#)).

Volcanic activity continues at several sites, including the Reventador volcano, which is producing volcanic ash reaching altitudes of up to 14,000 feet, posing potential hazards to aviation and nearby populations ([Volcano Discovery](#)). Other active volcanoes reported include Santiaguito, Fuego, Barren Island, Semeru, Shiveluch, Ibu, and Dukono ([Volcano Discovery](#)).

In space exploration news, NASA astronaut Chris Williams and his crewmates arrived at the International Space Station, continuing human presence and research in low Earth orbit ([NASA](#)). Additionally, NASA has released free out-of-school-time educational resources called PLANETS Units to engage students in planetary science ([NASA](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Romania's defense minister resigned following revelations of false claims in his curriculum vitae, a scandal with political ramifications within the country's government ([Politico](#)). In Germany, the parliament is set to approve €2.6 billion in new military equipment, reflecting ongoing efforts to modernize and strengthen defense capabilities ([Politico](#)).

Germany's coalition government has averted a crisis by reaching agreements on pension reforms and a ban on combustion engine vehicles, demonstrating political compromise on key domestic issues ([Politico](#)).

Internationally, the United Nations criticized Israel for what it described as "apparent summary executions" of Palestinians in the West Bank, highlighting ongoing tensions and human rights concerns ([France24](#)). Damascus condemned a recent Israeli military operation in southern Syria as a "war crime," reflecting the contentious nature of regional conflicts ([France24](#)).

Additional geopolitical developments include Denmark establishing a night watch to prevent any attempts by former U.S. President Trump to seize Greenland, a move



illustrating ongoing concerns about territorial sovereignty ([France24](#)). In Ukraine, the anti-corruption agency conducted searches of offices belonging to a top aide of President Zelensky, indicating efforts to address graft within the government ([France24](#)).

Scientific discoveries include the detection of lightning on Mars by a NASA rover and the expansion of knowledge of atmospheric phenomena beyond Earth ([BBC](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Archaeological discoveries in Jerusalem's City of David continue to shed light on the region's ancient history. Recently, an Assyrian inscription dating from the First Temple period was uncovered, providing valuable historical context ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Additionally, the largest dam from ancient Israel was excavated in the same area, revealing advanced engineering capabilities of the time ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).

Further significant finds include a rare gold coin of Egyptian Queen Berenice II discovered in the City of David, highlighting the interconnectedness of ancient Mediterranean cultures ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). A rare coin from the Year Four Revolt was also found in Jerusalem, offering tangible evidence of Jewish resistance during that period ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).
