### **Israel & Jerusalem**

On World AIDS Day, Israel’s Health Ministry reported a significant 22% decrease in new HIV cases for the year 2024, marking progress in the nation’s public health efforts ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has requested a presidential pardon amid ongoing legal challenges. This move has sparked debate over whether it serves Israel’s national interest ([Times of Israel](#)) and ([BBC](#)). In a stormy court hearing, Netanyahu accused the prosecutor of lying and of obscuring information, intensifying political and judicial tensions in the country ([Times of Israel](#)).

The Knesset Committee revealed alarming statistics indicating that over 1,400 Israelis die annually as a result of Palestinian “eco-terrorism,” highlighting the ongoing security and environmental challenges faced by the nation ([Israel365 News](#)). In the realm of defense technology, Israel continues to distinguish itself as a “Defense-Tech Nation,” with its ministry director emphasizing the country’s unique capabilities in this sector ([JNS](#)). On the diplomatic front, the Pope’s visit to Lebanon was met with controversy as Hezbollah welcomed him by attempting to rewrite the Abrahamic identity and erase Judaism from the narrative ([Israel365 News](#)).

Political responses to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict remain sharply divided. Minister Itamar Ben-Gvir publicly rejected the Pope’s call for a two-state solution, affirming his belief in the Torah of Israel as the foundation for peace ([JNS](#)). Additionally, Netanyahu’s recent political maneuvering has drawn attention, with analysts questioning whether his “wildcard” strategy could prove effective ([JNS](#)). The International Criminal Court’s chief has stated that U.S. sanctions will not influence the court’s handling of cases related to the region, underscoring the ongoing international legal complexities ([Al-Monitor](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Recent military operations have highlighted Israel’s ongoing security challenges in the region. A raid in Beit Jinn, southern Syria, exposed potential Hamas-linked networks



operating there, signaling the persistence of militant threats beyond Israel's borders ([Long War Journal](#)). In northern Iraq, the vital Khor Mor gas field was attacked, raising concerns about regional stability and the security of critical energy infrastructure ([Long War Journal](#)).

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) reported 14 ceasefire violations by Gaza militants between November 22 and 26, including an incident where a terrorist used an aid route to fire at Israeli troops, underscoring the fragile nature of the ceasefire and ongoing hostilities ([Long War Journal](#)). In addition, the IDF issued an evacuation order for Tehran ahead of planned strikes, reflecting escalating tensions and military preparedness in the region ([Jerusalem Post](#)).

International military cooperation is also evolving, with Greece hosting joint military exercises involving Israel, Cyprus, and the United Arab Emirates, signaling a strengthening of regional security alliances ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)). Meanwhile, Hezbollah faces internal shifts following the assassination of its top military commander, with analyses focusing on likely successors and the group's future direction ([Foundation for Defense of Democracies](#)).

## **Apostasy & Religious Developments**

Pope Leo XIV has continued his efforts to promote peace and Christian unity during his visit to Lebanon, a country currently facing severe crises. His arrival followed recent appeals for peace in Gaza and Ukraine, emphasizing the need for reconciliation in conflict zones ([Religion News Service](#)). In a related development, Pope Leo and Patriarch Bartholomew signed a declaration urging progress on Christian unity and peace, reflecting ongoing ecumenical efforts ([Religion News Service](#)).

In the United States, Rev. Winnie Varghese assumed the pulpit at St. John the Divine in New York City, marking a notable leadership transition within a prominent Episcopal church ([Religion News Service](#)). Meanwhile, Christian publications have addressed cultural and spiritual challenges, including articles discussing the harm caused by blaming women, the dangers of synthetic love, and questions about young men's attraction to Christ versus Christian culture ([Christianity Today](#)), ([Christianity Today](#)), and ([The Gospel Coalition](#)).

Persecution of believers remains a critical concern globally. A Chinese pastor was released after spending 12 years behind bars, highlighting the ongoing trials faced by Christians in restrictive environments ([International Christian Concern](#)). In Southeast Asia, a Thai



appeals court upheld a decision to extradite a Christian activist to Vietnam, raising fears for religious freedom in the region ([International Christian Concern](#)). Nigerian Christians have expressed skepticism about Western media explanations of climate change, reflecting complex intersections of faith, culture, and global narratives ([International Christian Concern](#)).

## **Biotechnology & Genetic Engineering**

Recent scientific studies have revealed new insights into factors affecting human health and disease. Research indicates that fructose consumption may quietly supercharge inflammation, potentially impacting the development of chronic disease ([ScienceDaily](#)). Another study identified a hidden obesity trigger in soybean oil, shedding light on dietary contributors to the obesity epidemic ([ScienceDaily](#)).

In cancer research, scientists discovered that human skin possesses a built-in cancer defense mechanism that sunlight can deactivate, providing new insights into skin cancer risks ([ScienceDaily](#)). Advances in genetic research also include the complete sequencing of the chloroplast genome of *Secale strictum* ssp. *strictum*, offering insights into the evolution and breeding of Triticeae species, which include essential cereal crops ([Nature](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Concerns about zoonotic diseases continue to grow as avian influenza demonstrates surprising heat tolerance, raising alarms among scientists about its potential spread and impact on human health ([ScienceDaily](#)). Stunning new three-dimensional images have revealed previously hidden structural details of the yellow fever virus, advancing understanding that could aid vaccine and treatment development ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Additionally, research into ancient viruses has uncovered secrets that may help combat modern superbugs, highlighting the ongoing importance of virology in global health ([ScienceDaily](#)). The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control has reported widespread avian influenza in birds, increasing the risk of human exposure and underscoring the need for vigilance in monitoring zoonotic diseases ([ECDC](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

On December 1, 2025, multiple seismic and volcanic events were recorded worldwide. Earthquake activity included a magnitude 2.4 tremor near El Moro, Colorado ([USGS](#)), a 1.4



magnitude quake near Anderson Springs, California ([USGS](#)), and a 3.1 magnitude event near Trapper Creek, Alaska ([USGS](#)).

Volcanic activity was noted at several sites, including Santiaguito, Fuego, Semeru, Shiveluch, Ibu, Dukono, Reventador, and Sangay volcanoes ([Volcano Discovery](#)). The Puracé Volcano emitted volcanic ash visible in satellite imagery, reaching altitudes of up to 19,000 feet (5,800 meters), prompting aviation safety advisories ([Volcano Discovery](#)).

In space exploration, NASA astronaut Chris Williams and crewmates arrived at the International Space Station, advancing human presence in orbit ([NASA](#)). Additionally, new organic compounds were discovered in the plumes of Enceladus, one of Saturn's moons, providing intriguing data for astrobiology research ([NASA](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

The United Kingdom has withdrawn funding for TotalEnergies' gas project in Mozambique following reports linking the project to massacres, reflecting growing international scrutiny of energy investments and human rights ([Politico](#)). UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer acknowledged that Brexit has "significantly" hurt the British economy, highlighting ongoing economic challenges post-Brexit ([Politico](#)).

In France, far-right presidential candidate Jordan Bardella experienced a traditional campaign ritual when he was pelted with eggs and flour during public appearances, illustrating the contentious nature of the election season ([Politico](#)). Meanwhile, French authorities sentenced a mayor to prison for blackmailing a political rival with a sex tape, underscoring issues of political corruption ([France24](#)).

In Ukraine, President Volodymyr Zelensky arrived in Paris for talks with French President Emmanuel Macron focused on security guarantees and pursuing a "fair and lasting peace" amid ongoing conflict ([France24](#)) and ([France24](#)). In Turkey, the PKK urged the government to free Abdullah Öcalan, warning that the peace process will halt if demands are not met ([France24](#)).

Severe flooding in Indonesia has resulted in a death toll exceeding 500, with hundreds more missing, marking a major natural disaster in the region ([BBC](#)). In Bangladesh, UK Member of Parliament Tulip Siddiq was sentenced to jail after a trial conducted in her absence, highlighting complex international legal and political issues ([BBC](#)).

## **Middle Eastern Artifacts**



Archaeological discoveries in Jerusalem's City of David continue to shed light on the region's ancient history. An Assyrian inscription dating back to the First Temple period was uncovered, providing valuable historical context ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Additionally, the largest dam from ancient Israel was recently excavated in the same area, revealing advanced engineering capabilities of the time ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).

Among rare finds is a gold coin of Egyptian Queen Berenice II discovered in the City of David, offering insight into the cultural and economic exchanges of the period ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Furthermore, a rare coin from the Year Four Revolt was found in Jerusalem, symbolizing the historical struggle for redemption and sovereignty in Zion ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).

The religious landscape reflects both hopeful movements toward unity and troubling signs of apostasy and persecution, calling the Church to remain vigilant and faithful. Meanwhile, natural disasters and geopolitical tensions continue to shape the global environment, reminding believers of the urgency to pray and act with discernment.

As Christians, we are called to intercede for Israel, the persecuted Church, and the broader world in these turbulent times. The biblical narrative assures us that God remains sovereign over all nations and history, and our hope rests in His redemptive plan fulfilled in Christ.
