



Global Watch Daily – December 11, 2025

A concise summary of major developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

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Israel & Jerusalem

Recent discussions have raised questions about the viability of the two-state solution as a future path for peace between Israel and the Palestinians ([Times of Israel](#)). In a move affecting education policy, Israel plans to ban cellphones from elementary schools nationwide starting in February, aiming to reduce distractions and improve learning environments ([Times of Israel](#)). Meanwhile, a poignant article reflects on how residents of Jerusalem, despite the city's recent conflicts, continue to see their homes as places of refuge and identity amid the turmoil ([Israel365 News](#)).

Weather patterns have brought Hurricane Byron's rains to Israel, replenishing vital water reservoirs at a time when neighboring Iran is facing worsening drought ([Israel365 News](#)). Scientists in Israel have identified specific immune cells that could slow the aging process, a discovery that some say echoes Messianic prophecies of restoration and renewal ([Israel365 News](#)). On the security front, the United Nations envoy has vowed to keep Hezbollah in check to prevent escalation in the region ([JNS](#)).

Diplomatic activity includes an unpublicized visit by a Taiwanese minister to Israel, signaling discreet international engagements ([JNS](#)). Meanwhile, the Israeli UN envoy has accused Hamas of hoarding baby formula in Gaza to bolster claims of famine, highlighting ongoing humanitarian concerns amid conflict ([JNS](#)). Iran has appealed to the United Nations over what it describes as tightening restrictions on its diplomats in New York, reflecting tensions in international diplomacy ([Al-Monitor](#)).

Heavy rains have flooded tents in Gaza, tragically resulting in the death of a baby due to exposure, according to medical sources ([Al-Monitor](#)). In the context of peace efforts, Israel has stated that Hamas will be disarmed following the group's proposal for a weapons freeze, though Hamas has rejected complete disarmament ([Al-Monitor](#); [France24](#); [France24](#)).



In a diplomatic incident, Ghana has deported Israelis in retaliation for the alleged mistreatment of Ghanaians, indicating rising tensions between the two countries ([BBC](#)). Additionally, the United States has deported a second group of Iranian nationals, reflecting ongoing immigration enforcement related to geopolitical concerns ([BBC](#)).

Military preparations continue as the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) issued an evacuation order for Tehran ahead of planned strikes, signaling heightened alertness in the region ([Jerusalem Post](#)). The Israeli Defense Ministry also announced a military exercise on Highway 35 scheduled for Sunday afternoon, aimed at readiness and response training ([Jerusalem Post](#)). Furthermore, a Ukrainian drone attack on Moscow forced the temporary closure of an airport, illustrating the ongoing conflict between Ukraine and Russia ([Jerusalem Post](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The Israel Defense Forces have revealed the existence of a Hamas financial network operating within Turkey, highlighting the transnational nature of militant financing ([Long War Journal](#)). Israeli military operations in Lebanon against Hezbollah have been ongoing throughout the first week of December, reflecting continued efforts to counter threats along the northern border ([Long War Journal](#)).

In Iraq, an investigation concluded that drones were responsible for striking the Khor Mor gas field, prompting the Kurdistan Region to request enhanced air defenses to protect critical infrastructure ([Long War Journal](#)). Meanwhile, Ukraine is preparing a revised peace plan to present to the United States, seeking diplomatic avenues amid ongoing conflict ([FDD](#)). This follows the recent marking of one year since the fall of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad, a significant milestone in the Syrian conflict ([FDD](#)).

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy is reportedly preparing to send a peace proposal to former U.S. President Donald Trump, indicating ongoing efforts to explore alternative diplomatic channels ([FDD](#)).

Apostasy & Religious Developments

In the United States, clergy members have taken an active role in protesting Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), demonstrating a growing trend of religious leaders engaging in social justice activism ([Religion News Service](#)). The 50th anniversary of Christ Church has brought attention to Doug Wilson's influence in promoting Christian



nationalism within American religious and political discourse ([Religion News Service](#)).

At a cathedral event, governors from different political parties and faith backgrounds jointly urged an end to political violence, emphasizing the role of faith in promoting peace and unity ([Religion News Service](#)). Christian writers have also addressed modern challenges such as phone idolatry, encouraging believers to resist distractions and focus on spiritual growth ([The Gospel Coalition](#)).

Concerns about emerging technologies are reflected in warnings about the rise of sex robots and their implications for the church, calling for vigilance and discernment ([The Gospel Coalition](#)). Family dynamics are also discussed, with advice on common mistakes parents make in their relationships with their child's grandparents ([Crosswalk](#)).

A former atheist filmmaker has produced a documentary making the case for God, contributing to contemporary apologetics ([Crosswalk](#)). Christian singer Anne Wilson shared how being bullied shaped her mission to help girls discover their worth, highlighting personal testimony as a ministry tool ([Crosswalk](#)).

Persecution remains a grave concern globally. A drone strike on Kumo resulted in 45 deaths and dozens injured, underscoring the dangers faced by civilians in conflict zones ([International Christian Concern](#)). In Indonesia, Muslims have protested the construction of a church, reflecting ongoing religious tensions ([International Christian Concern](#)). In Nigeria, 50 children escaped, and 100 were rescued after a mass abduction at a school, highlighting the persistent threat of violence against Christian communities ([International Christian Concern](#)).

Biotechnology & Genetic Engineering

Scientists have uncovered a hidden survival mechanism that allows cancer cells to rebound after treatment, a discovery that may influence future therapies ([ScienceDaily](#)). Blood tests have revealed that obesity rapidly accelerates the progression of Alzheimer's disease, emphasizing the importance of addressing obesity for brain health ([ScienceDaily](#)).

New research has identified a previously unknown mechanism that changes the understanding of cell division, potentially impacting cancer and developmental biology ([ScienceDaily](#)). Additionally, overexpression of a milk thistle gene in tobacco plants has been shown to enhance drought tolerance by improving photosynthesis and photoprotection, with potential agricultural applications ([Nature](#)).



Advances in gene editing include in vivo editing of DNA methylation, a development that could lead to new treatments for genetic diseases ([Nature](#)). Another breakthrough involves a high-precision transgene knock-in technique combining Recombinases and CRISPR-Cas9, enhancing the accuracy of genetic modifications ([Nature](#)).

In health technology, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) health IT chief has hinted at a new approach to electronic health record (EHR) certification, aiming to improve health data interoperability ([STAT News](#)). However, research indicates that fewer hospitals are now able to treat children, raising concerns about the availability of pediatric care ([STAT News](#)). Meanwhile, Eli Lilly's next-generation obesity drug retatrutide has shown significant weight loss results in Phase 3 trials, though with a high rate of treatment discontinuation due to side effects ([STAT News](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Scientists have identified volcanic activity as a trigger behind the Black Death pandemic, providing new insight into historical disease outbreaks ([ScienceDaily](#)). In modern health developments, garlic-based mouthwash has demonstrated surprisingly strong germ-fighting properties, suggesting potential natural alternatives for oral hygiene ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Researchers have captured real-time footage of flu viruses entering human cells, advancing understanding of viral infection mechanisms ([ScienceDaily](#)). The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) has released an overview of avian influenza cases from September to November 2025, noting ongoing surveillance efforts ([ECDC](#)).

The ECDC also published a communicable disease threats report covering the week of November 29 to December 5, 2025, highlighting current infectious disease risks in Europe ([ECDC](#)). Furthermore, the agency has defined strategies to combat avian and swine flu in humans, aiming to prevent potential pandemics ([ECDC](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

On December 11, 2025, several earthquakes were recorded globally, including a magnitude 3.4 quake southeast of King Salmon, Alaska ([USGS](#)), a magnitude 1.2 quake northwest of Pinnacles, California ([USGS](#)), and a magnitude 1.9 quake north-northeast of Paxson, Alaska ([USGS](#)).



Volcanic activity has been observed at Santiaguito Volcano, where volcanic ash reached 14,000 feet (4,300 meters), prompting air traffic advisories ([VolcanoDiscovery](#)). Similarly, Ibu Volcano emitted ash up to 6,000 feet (1,800 meters), prompting advisories ([VolcanoDiscovery](#)).

NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory has unveiled a new Rover Operations Center designed to support upcoming missions to the Moon and Mars, marking a significant advancement in space exploration infrastructure ([NASA](#)). Additionally, NASA celebrated 25 years of space station technology driving exploration efforts, underscoring the long-term impact of human spaceflight ([NASA](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Bulgaria's government collapsed following weeks of mass protests against corruption, leading to the resignation of Prime Minister Rosen Zhelyazkov ([Politico](#)). The European Union has launched investigations into Chinese companies Nuctech and Temu over allegations of unfair foreign subsidies, reflecting ongoing trade tensions ([Politico](#)).

Venezuelan Nobel Peace Prize winner Maria Corina Machado made a surprise appearance in Oslo after months in hiding, drawing international attention to Venezuela's political situation ([Politico](#); [BBC](#)). The United States seized an oil tanker off Venezuela's coast, an act condemned by Caracas as piracy ([BBC](#)).

In Southeast Asia, Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim met with Thai and Cambodian leaders amid ongoing border conflicts to seek peaceful resolutions ([The Diplomat](#)). Meanwhile, reports indicate that the Indonesia-US trade agreement is at risk of collapse, raising concerns about economic relations ([The Diplomat](#)). Palau faces a climate paradox amid the era dubbed "Trump 2.0," highlighting the complex challenges of climate policy ([The Diplomat](#)).

Europe is considering new asylum and migration policies, with Denmark's model proposed as a potential lead for reform efforts ([France24](#)). Despite challenges, the transatlantic alliance between the United States and Europe remains intact, bound by shared history, culture, trade, and military cooperation ([France24](#)).

In France, the city of Marseille is experiencing panic due to lethal violence linked to drug gangs, with children among the victims, raising concerns about urban security and social stability ([BBC](#)).



Middle Eastern Artifacts

Archaeologists have discovered an Assyrian inscription dating from the First Temple period, providing valuable insight into the ancient history of Jerusalem ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Excavations in the City of David have also uncovered the largest dam in ancient Israel, shedding light on historical water management systems ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).

A rare gold coin belonging to Egyptian Queen Berenice II was found in the City of David, illustrating the region's connections with the wider ancient world ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)). Additionally, a rare coin from the Year Four Revolt was discovered in Jerusalem, symbolizing the historical struggles for the redemption of Zion ([City of David - News in Antiquities](#)).
