Israel & Jerusalem

South Africa has expelled Israel's top envoy, Ariel Siedman, accusing him of violating diplomatic norms, including insulting the president and failing to notify the government of official visits; in response, Israel declared South Africa's envoy persona non grata. This diplomatic conflict unfolds amid heightened regional tensions, as the IDF has issued evacuation orders for Tehran ahead of potential strikes, underscoring the fragile security situation ([Jerusalem Post](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

From a cultural perspective, Jewish law and tradition emphasize responsibility toward all inhabitants of the land, including those from diverse cultures and religions, highlighting a grounded ethical framework amid ongoing geopolitical challenges ([JNS](#); [Times of Israel](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Hostilities continue to escalate between Damascus government forces and the Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces despite ongoing US-mediated ceasefire talks. Recent protests and political upheavals highlight global tensions: former CNN host Don Lemon was arrested during anti-ICE protests in Minnesota, while Texas police used tear gas to disperse similar demonstrations at a detention center, reflecting ongoing debates over immigration enforcement ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).

In Burkina Faso, the military junta has banned all political parties, citing the multiparty system as a source of division, while ASEAN refuses to recognize Myanmar's military election, signaling ongoing regional instability and political contestation ([BBC News](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

A global study reveals that long COVID brain fog and related symptoms are reported far more frequently in the U.S. than in countries such as India and Nigeria.
