



Global Watch Daily – February 10, 2026

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A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

Israel & Jerusalem

Indonesia is preparing to deploy up to 8,000 troops as part of an international force aimed at stabilizing Gaza, potentially contributing to a total of 20,000 soldiers under a ceasefire agreement brokered by the US last year. This commitment makes Indonesia the first country to pledge troops for phase two of the ceasefire, marking a significant regional development amid ongoing tensions. Meanwhile, allegations have surfaced accusing Israel of spraying chemicals to poison farmland in Syria and Lebanon, raising concerns about environmental warfare in the region. Diplomatic strains continue as Iran warns the US against Israel's 'destructive' influence on negotiations, signaling challenges ahead in the peace process ([Times of Israel](#); [BBC News](#)).

The Israeli Defense Forces have issued evacuation orders for Tehran in anticipation of potential strikes, underscoring escalating military alertness in the region. Concurrently, analysis highlights the dangers of a narrow nuclear deal involving the US, Iran, and Israel, emphasizing the need for strategic depth beyond mere displays of power. These developments unfold amid complex regional dynamics, including ongoing negotiations and military posturing ([Jerusalem Post](#); [JNS](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

Hezbollah's deputy leader, Naim Qassem, delivered a defiant speech commemorating the 33rd anniversary of the Mahdi Schools, affirming Iran's divine promise of victory over the US and Israel and reiterating Hezbollah's refusal to disarm. At the same time, Syrian government forces have deployed in northeastern Syria under a recent agreement with the Syrian Democratic Forces, aiming to restore central authority in Kurdish-controlled areas amid ongoing US military operations against Islamic State targets. These movements reflect shifting power balances and persistent conflict throughout the region ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).



On the global stage, China has denied US accusations of conducting secret low-yield nuclear tests, labeling the claims as outright lies that would violate the global testing moratorium. In Hong Kong, pro-democracy activist Jimmy Lai was sentenced to 20 years in prison, highlighting ongoing political repression. Meanwhile, experts from Chatham House testified before the UK Parliament on Venezuela, stressing the need for pre-emptive diplomacy to uphold international norms amid challenges posed by US policy. These developments underscore rising geopolitical tensions and threats to democratic principles worldwide ([FDD](#); [FDD](#); [Chatham House](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

US lawmakers from both parties have accused the Justice Department of improperly redacting files related to Jeffrey Epstein, raising serious concerns about transparency and accountability. In cultural news, Bad Bunny's Super Bowl performance resonated deeply with Puerto Rican identity, symbolizing unity among Latinos while highlighting the artist's personal connection to the island. Meanwhile, deportees in Guatemala are rebuilding their lives after forced removal from the US, illustrating the human impact of immigration policies enacted under the Trump administration. The United Nations has expressed grave concern over Israel's plans for the West Bank, amid widespread international outrage and condemnation from Muslim-majority countries. Additionally, Southeast Asia faces challenges, including Russia recruiting mercenaries from the region and political setbacks for progressive Thai MPs who face lifetime bans, reflecting broader geopolitical shifts ([BBC News](#); [France24](#); [France24](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Recent studies reveal that both H1N1 and COVID-19 spread rapidly across US cities within weeks, driven largely by major travel hubs and air travel, complicating real-time forecasting and underscoring the need for early detection systems. In Australia, scientists have identified a sugar unique to bacterial cells that can be targeted by antibodies to defeat deadly drug-resistant superbugs, offering a promising new approach to combating infections. Meanwhile, a novel nasal spray vaccine has demonstrated strong protection against H5N1 bird flu in animal tests, potentially preventing infection at its earliest stages by targeting the respiratory tract. These advances highlight ongoing efforts to understand and control infectious diseases globally ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).



Additionally, researchers in Bangladesh have detected a bat-borne virus infecting humans, raising concerns about the risk of undetected zoonotic diseases circulating alongside known threats such as the Nipah virus. A global study on long COVID brain fog found significantly higher reports of cognitive symptoms in the US compared to countries like India and Nigeria, suggesting cultural and healthcare access factors influence symptom reporting. In Guatemala, trusted bottled water sources were frequently contaminated, highlighting public health risks to water safety. These findings emphasize the complexity of global health challenges and the importance of vigilant monitoring ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 1.9 earthquake near Ugashik, Alaska, and a magnitude 1.4 earthquake near Toyah, Texas, both recorded on February 10, 2026. Additionally, a magnitude 1.8 earthquake occurred southeast of Pāhala, Hawaii, indicating ongoing low-level tectonic activity in this region. Meanwhile, Japan's northern regions are experiencing unrelenting winter storms that have disrupted transportation and daily life, underscoring the challenges posed by severe weather. NASA's SpaceX Crew-12 mission is set to launch four crew members to the International Space Station for research and technology demonstrations, highlighting continued advancements in space exploration. Meteorological agencies report a Pacific storm moving inland with a clipper system affecting the Northeast and a strong storm impacting Alaska, reflecting dynamic weather patterns across the US ([USGS](#); [NASA](#); [weather.gov](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Excavations on Ha-Te'uda Ha-Aduma Street in Yafo have uncovered fourteen military artifacts, including cannonballs and small-caliber bullets, likely linked to historical sieges of Yafo in the late 18th century, such as those by Muhammad Beq Abu-Dahab and Napoleon. Additionally, about fifty glass items dating from the late 19th to mid-20th centuries were found, reflecting local daily life through medicine, cosmetic, and beverage bottles, as well as bracelet fragments spanning from the Mamluk to Ottoman periods. Further, salvage excavations at Khirbat 'Amra in the Be'er Sheva Valley revealed architectural remains and artifacts from the Hellenistic to Early Islamic periods, offering valuable insights into the region's multiperiod history. These findings enrich understanding of the cultural and military heritage of the Middle East ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).
