Israel & Jerusalem

Pro-Iranian mobs attempted to storm U.S. embassies in Pakistan and Iraq, resulting in at least eight deaths amid violent clashes and the use of tear gas ([Times of Israel](#); [JNS](#)).

Israeli Defense Minister Katz described the death of Iran’s Supreme Leader Khamenei as a turning point, affirming that the war will continue until its objectives are fulfilled and the Iranian people can remove the regime ([JNS](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Iran reported at least 148 deaths following a strike on a school, blaming the U.S. and Israel, although the IDF denies knowledge of any operations in the area ([BBC News](#); [Times of Israel](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The U.S. and Israel have launched an extensive military campaign against Iran, reportedly killing Supreme Leader Khamenei, following failed nuclear talks and rising regional tensions ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Escalating conflict between Pakistan and the Afghan Taliban has prompted Operation Righteous Fury, with the Pakistani military striking multiple targets in Afghanistan following Taliban attacks on military outposts ([Long War Journal](#)).

Experts warn of potential global economic repercussions from the strikes on Iran, while diplomatic shifts include the appointment of Owen Jenkins as Research Director for Africa, the Middle East, and Asia Pacific at Chatham House ([FDD](#); [Chatham House](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Iranian drone and missile strikes caused casualties and damage at Dubai and Abu Dhabi airports, resulting in one death and eleven injuries as debris fell across the Gulf region ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).



Israel has renewed attacks “in the heart of Tehran” amid ongoing missile fire, while reactions to Khamenei’s death continue to unfold across Iran ([France24](#); [France24](#)).

Amid global power competition, countries such as Mongolia, South Korea, and Brazil are strengthening ties and reviving trade talks to diversify supply chains and navigate the intensifying rivalry between China and the U.S. ([The Diplomat](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Scientists have discovered a bacterial kill switch using viral proteins that disable a key bacterial protein, offering promising new avenues to combat drug-resistant bacteria ([ScienceDaily](#)).

New vaccines are showing promise beyond their original purposes: the shingles vaccine may slow biological aging and inflammation, while a universal nasal spray vaccine could protect against COVID, flu, and pneumonia ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Researchers are engineering bacteria to consume cancer tumors from within, and a 5,000-year-old ice-cave bacterium has demonstrated resistance to modern antibiotics, highlighting ongoing challenges in infection control ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Studies have linked the common pneumonia bacterium *Chlamydia pneumoniae* to the progression of Alzheimer’s disease, with inflammation and nerve cell death observed in affected brains ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 1.1 earthquake near Yakutat, Alaska, and a 1.0 quake near Cloverdale, California, with depths of 2.37 to 13.3 kilometers ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

NASA is advancing lunar exploration by testing solar concentrators designed to extract oxygen from simulated lunar soil, supporting future missions to the Moon ([NASA](#)).

NASA’s Armstrong Flight Research Center continues to pioneer high-speed, autonomous, and electrified aircraft technologies, pushing aeronautics innovation forward in the Mojave Desert ([NASA](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts



Recent archaeological excavations have uncovered significant finds, including a cistern beneath a Crusader wall at Mi'iliya and ossuaries in a burial cave at Khirbat Jamnith, shedding light on historical periods ([Israel Antiquities Authority](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).

Discoveries also include a rare half-shekel coin from the First Jewish Revolt and Crusader swords found off the coast of Dor, as well as new exhibits featuring the Great Isaiah Scroll that enhance biblical historical understanding ([BiblePlaces](#)).
