



Global Watch Daily – March 6, 2026

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A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

Israel & Jerusalem

Israel continues its aerial campaigns targeting Iran and Lebanon, with strikes spreading across the region amid warnings from Donald Trump that these operations may last for weeks. The Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in East Jerusalem was notably empty during the third Friday of Ramadan due to Israeli restrictions on access to holy sites, underscoring ongoing tensions in the city. Meanwhile, Michael Moritz, a UK-born tycoon, has applied for a German passport, citing rising Jew-hate in Britain, contrasting with Germany's emphasis on Holocaust education as a safeguard. Emergency response coordination remains critical as Magen David Adom manages ambulance dispatches amid missile threats in this multi-front conflict ([Times of Israel](#); [JNS](#)).

The White House is urging defense firms such as Lockheed Martin and Raytheon to increase production to replenish stockpiles depleted by strikes on Iran, highlighting the strategic importance of military readiness. Drone footage has revealed the emptiness of the Al-Aqsa compound, reflecting heightened security measures and the fragile status quo in Jerusalem. These developments coincide with widespread strikes across the Middle East, including Lebanon and Iran, as part of a broader regional conflict. Coordination of Israel's emergency response efforts remains vital in this volatile environment ([Times of Israel](#); [BBC News](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The ongoing conflict in the Middle East has seen Iran targeting US bases, diplomatic missions, and oil infrastructure across several Arab Gulf countries with ballistic missiles, cruise missiles, and drones, intensifying regional hostilities. Hezbollah's leadership has vowed to fight until the end, reinforcing its commitment to the war against Israel and signaling potential shifts in Lebanon's security dynamics. Ukraine has pledged to assist the US and its Middle Eastern allies in combating Iranian drones, leveraging its extensive counter-drone experience gained from Russian attacks. These developments highlight a complex, multi-front security environment involving state and non-state actors ([Long War](#)

Iranian-backed militias continue their attacks on US forces in Iraq, with drone and missile strikes particularly targeting Iraqi Kurdistan, where American troops are stationed. The US-Israel military campaign against Iran also factors into the evolving leadership dynamics within Iran, as regional and global powers navigate the conflict's implications. Hezbollah's recklessness may inadvertently restore Israel's former security zone in southern Lebanon, potentially altering the strategic landscape. These intertwined military and political developments underscore the region's volatility and high stakes ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

Tensions between Hungary and Ukraine have escalated as Hungary detains Ukrainian bank workers on suspicion of money laundering, deepening the diplomatic rift between the two nations. Azerbaijan has placed its armed forces on high alert following drone strikes attributed to Iran, which President Ilham Aliyev condemns as acts of terror spilling over the border. Conservative Anglican leaders in Nigeria challenge the historic female leader of the Anglican Communion by establishing rival leadership, reflecting broader conflicts over liberal trends within global Anglicanism. Meanwhile, a mine collapse in eastern Congo has resulted in at least 200 deaths, with rebel groups disputing official tolls amid ongoing humanitarian crises ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).

The Philippines has arrested three defense personnel accused of relaying sensitive information to China, including details about resupply missions in the South China Sea, raising concerns about espionage and regional security. Historical reflections on the American War in Vietnam highlight the role of Tran Le Xuan, South Vietnam's "first lady," who was both a passionate supporter of the southern republic and a fierce critic of US involvement. These geopolitical developments illustrate the complexity of international relations and the persistent challenges posed by espionage, historical memory, and regional conflicts ([The Diplomat](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Scientists have identified Aurora-related kinase 1 (ARK1) as a critical protein necessary for malaria parasites to replicate, offering a promising target for new treatments that could halt the disease's spread. In parallel, researchers have discovered a bacterial kill switch involving viral proteins that disable the MurJ protein, which is essential for bacterial cell wall construction, potentially revolutionizing the fight against antibiotic-resistant



superbugs. These breakthroughs provide hope for combating persistent global health threats through innovative biological approaches ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Additional advances include a shingles vaccine shown to slow biological aging and reduce inflammation in older adults, potentially mitigating age-related diseases. Scientists have engineered bacteria capable of invading and consuming cancer tumors from the inside, representing a novel therapeutic strategy. Moreover, a universal nasal spray vaccine has been developed to protect against COVID-19, flu, pneumonia, and allergens by enhancing lung immune defenses. However, a 5,000-year-old ice-cave bacterium resistant to modern antibiotics underscores the ongoing challenges of addressing antibiotic resistance ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Recent seismic activity near The Geysers, California, includes multiple earthquakes ranging from magnitude 1.0 to 1.5 at shallow depths, monitored by the USGS to assess potential risks. In the South Atlantic Ocean, the disintegration of Iceberg A-23A has released meltwater that has fueled a significant phytoplankton bloom, impacting marine ecosystems. NASA's Air Traffic Management and Safety project continues to develop advanced technologies to shift air traffic control from tactical to strategic management, enhancing safety and efficiency. Severe thunderstorms and critical fire weather conditions are forecasted from the southern Plains to the Midwest, emphasizing the need for preparedness ([USGS](#); [NASA](#)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Recent archaeological updates include the relocation of significant artifacts from the Israel Museum to secure locations to safeguard them amid regional instability. Excavations at Emesa (modern Homs, Syria) reveal the gradual transformation of a powerful pagan city into Christian and then Muslim centers, illustrating the region's complex religious history. Discoveries such as a rare half-shekel coin from the First Jewish Revolt and Crusader swords off the coast of Dor enrich understanding of the area's ancient heritage. The Israel Antiquities Authority continues to publish detailed findings from Jerusalem's Giv'at Shapira site, contributing valuable insights into the city's past ([BiblePlaces](#); [Israel Antiquities Authority](#)).
