### **Israel & Jerusalem**

NASA's Artemis II mission marked a significant milestone when all four astronauts returned safely and walked unassisted after splashdown, signaling a hopeful return to lunar exploration by 2028 ([Times of Israel](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

In political developments, former U.S. Congressman Eliot Engel, a steadfast supporter of Israel, passed away and is remembered for his leadership in opposing delegitimization efforts ([JNS](#)). Meanwhile, historic talks between Iran and the U.S. sought to bridge deep-seated distrust, marking the highest level of engagement since 1979 ([BBC News](#)).

Controversy arose when the IDF removed a Passover song clip criticized for its portrayal of women, highlighting ongoing cultural sensitivities within the military ([Times of Israel](#)). Additionally, a Palestinian NGO linked to terror groups was shut down after 35 years due to Israeli restrictions ([JNS](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

The U.S. and Israeli forces completed a 40-day campaign that significantly degraded Iran's military capabilities, though it did not eliminate Tehran's ability to project power regionally ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Amid ongoing conflict, Syria has taken a diplomatic approach by engaging with Turkey, the U.S., and Ukraine to maintain stability despite regional missile and drone attacks ([Long War Journal](#)). Meanwhile, Costa Rica designated the IRGC and Iranian proxies as terrorist groups, signaling growing international concern over Tehran's influence ([FDD](#)).

Despite a fragile ceasefire, Iran and its militias continue attacks on regional states, particularly in the Gulf and neighboring countries, raising doubts about the durability of peace efforts ([Long War Journal](#)). Analysts debate whether the recent ceasefire is a long-term strategy or merely a temporary pause ([Long War Journal](#)).



## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

Beirut struggles to recover from recent deadly Israeli attacks, with local voices sharing their experiences amid ongoing tensions ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).

Djibouti's president secured an unprecedented sixth term with 97.8% of the vote in an election boycotted by opposition candidates, extending his 27-year rule ([BBC News](#)). Meanwhile, Russia and Ukraine exchanged 175 prisoners each in a rare cooperative move ahead of an Easter truce ([France24](#)).

Iran's chief negotiator, Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf, leads a 70-member delegation in Pakistan, underscoring Tehran's commitment to securing a war-ending agreement on its terms ([France24](#)). Meanwhile, Thailand announced additional asset seizures as part of a widening scam probe involving a South African businessman ([The Diplomat](#)).

Labor conditions remain dire for migrant workers in Southeast Asia's fishing and seafood industries, highlighting ongoing human rights concerns in the region ([The Diplomat](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

New research reveals that diets rich in casein and wheat gluten proteins can reduce cholera infections by up to 100 times by disabling bacterial weapons, offering a promising dietary approach to combating this deadly disease ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Scientists have identified beznafosbuvir, a drug already in trials for hepatitis C, as a potential treatment for hepatitis E by blocking viral replication without harming healthy tissue, potentially offering a much-needed therapy for this virus, which currently has no approved treatments ([ScienceDaily](#)).

A breakthrough urine test can now identify the correct antibiotic for urinary tract infections within six hours by testing urine samples directly, dramatically speeding treatment and improving accuracy compared to traditional culturing methods ([ScienceDaily](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity included a magnitude 1.2 earthquake southwest of Ackerly, Texas, and a magnitude 1.4 event near Susitna North, Alaska, both recorded on April 11, 2026 ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).



NASA captured the dramatic splashdown of the Artemis II Orion spacecraft in the Pacific Ocean, marking a successful conclusion to a record-setting mission that surpassed Apollo 13's distance and provided unique views of the Moon's far side ([NASA](#)).

Additional seismic activity included a magnitude 1.3 quake near San Ramon, California, while weather concerns persist with record warmth spreading eastward and severe weather impacting the Plains ([USGS](#); [weather.gov](#)).

### **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Theories about the Ark of the Covenant continue to captivate, with some suggesting it may be hidden in a New York warehouse, while archaeological efforts in Israel aim to establish a leading scientific repository using AI tools ([BiblePlaces](#); [BiblePlaces](#)).

Recent discoveries include a First Temple period seal impression bearing Egyptian symbols and evidence of a visitor from India in Egypt's Valley of the Kings, challenging previous scholarly views about Queen Hatshepsut ([BiblePlaces](#)).

Archaeologists also uncovered a shipwreck off Dor dating to circa 600 BC carrying smelted iron, the first evidence of iron trade in this form, alongside the seizure of dozens of rare coins from a smuggling attempt by a Palestinian doctor ([BiblePlaces](#)).
