A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Iran executed Mehdi Farid on charges of passing sensitive intelligence to Mossad, escalating tensions in the region. At the same time, Iran seized two vessels in the Strait of Hormuz following attacks, underscoring ongoing maritime security challenges ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

In the occupied West Bank, Israeli settlers set fire to a Palestinian home, further intensifying local tensions amid ongoing conflicts. Meanwhile, lawmakers from Latin America united to combat antisemitism, condemning the BDS movement and affirming Israel's right to self-defense ([Al Jazeera](#); [JNS](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

Hamas indicated a willingness to surrender some weapons, though it stopped short of the full disarmament demanded by peace proposals, while the IDF reported multiple ceasefire violations. In Iraq, political uncertainty deepens as Shiite factions delay nominating a new prime minister amid US warnings about Iran-backed militia threats, with the IRGC-Qods Force leader visiting to strengthen influence ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Although headlines suggest calm on the Lebanese front, underlying disputes remain unresolved, and the US economic blockade continues to strain Iran financially. The US Treasury designated seven Iran-backed Iraqi militia commanders as terrorists, reflecting ongoing efforts to counter destabilizing forces in the region ([FDD](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Iran's regional war efforts have diminished against Arab states but continue against Iraqi Kurdistan. Reports also reveal the involvement of UAE-backed Colombian mercenaries in Sudanese paramilitary activities, highlighting complex proxy dynamics ([Long War Journal](#); [BBC News](#)).

### **Global Macro & Geopolitics**



The European Union approved a €90 billion loan for Ukraine as the Druzhba pipeline resumed oil flow, easing supply deadlocks with Hungary. However, Lufthansa cut 20,000 summer flights due to soaring jet fuel prices driven by the US-Israel war with Iran, reflecting broader economic ripple effects ([BBC News](#); [BBC News](#)).

UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer faced parliamentary scrutiny over security lapses related to the appointment of Peter Mandelson as diplomat to Washington, amid opposition calls for his resignation. Meanwhile, concerns over labor rights and free speech emerged in Eswatini-Taiwan relations, highlighting geopolitical and human rights complexities ([France24](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

The US strategic approach to the Iran conflict reveals incoherence, with diverse perspectives from Asian allies and regional players shaping the war's trajectory. Meanwhile, seasonal traditions in France show lilies of the valley blooming early this year, a small sign of changing times amid global unrest ([The Diplomat](#); [France24](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

Scientists have identified madecassic acid from *Centella asiatica* as a potent agent against drug-resistant bacteria, offering hope for new antibiotics. Research also revealed that bacteria use virus-like particles to spread antibiotic resistance by bursting open, uncovering novel mechanisms of microbial gene transfer ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Public restrooms pose hidden health risks from "toilet plumes" and poor hand hygiene rather than from toilet seats, emphasizing the need for improved sanitation practices. Breakthrough nanodisc technology has revealed hidden weak spots in HIV and Ebola viruses, advancing vaccine development efforts ([ScienceDaily](#); [ScienceDaily](#)).

Scientists have solved the mystery behind rare COVID vaccine-induced blood clots by identifying immune system confusion with a blood protein, enabling safer vaccine designs. This breakthrough enhances vaccine safety while maintaining efficacy against the virus ([ScienceDaily](#)).

## **Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens**

Recent seismic activity includes a magnitude 1.1 quake near Pinnacles, California, and a 1.9 event near Topaz Ranch Estates, Nevada, indicating ongoing tectonic movements. A stronger magnitude 4.5 earthquake struck near Noda, Japan, underscoring global earthquake hazards ([USGS](#); [USGS](#); [USGS](#)).



NASA highlights green belts in Washington suburbs, illustrating urban-nature integration, while the Artemis II mission successfully completed its lunar orbit and splashdown, marking a milestone in crewed space exploration ([NASA](#); [NASA](#)).

A strong storm system brought heavy mountain snow to the Sierra Nevada and critical fire weather conditions to the Plains, emphasizing the variability and intensity of current weather patterns ([weather.gov](#)).

### **Middle Eastern Artifacts**

Excavations in Egypt uncovered painted sarcophagi and papyrus scrolls from the Third Intermediate Period, enriching our understanding of ancient funerary practices. Additionally, a temple dedicated to the local god Pelusius was unearthed after six years of archaeological work ([BiblePlaces](#)).

Studies reveal that shepherds moved flocks between Galilee and the Golan Heights during the 10th to 8th centuries BC despite regional conflicts, while a mass grave for children was discovered at Azekah, shedding light on historical struggles. The reopening of holy sites in Jerusalem and the temporary closure of the Great Isaiah Scroll exhibition highlight ongoing cultural preservation efforts ([BiblePlaces](#); [BiblePlaces](#)).
