A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

### **Israel & Jerusalem**

Inbar Yehezkeli Bliliou, a Jerusalem lawyer and former CEO of the Jerusalem Sexual Assault Crisis Center, has been appointed to lead a national recovery plan, signaling a renewed focus on social issues within Israel ([JNS](#)). At the same time, Israel intercepted a Gaza flotilla near Crete, detaining 175 activists amid ongoing regional tensions ([BBC News](#)).

Regional instability is further underscored by Iran’s Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei, who recently issued a series of tweets hinting at a new chapter for the Persian Gulf and the Strait of Hormuz ([JNS](#)). Additionally, Iran’s shadow fleet continues to evade the US naval blockade through deceptive tactics, complicating maritime security efforts ([Al Jazeera](#)).

Meanwhile, Syria’s ongoing trial of former regime officials represents a tentative step toward justice for victims of Assad’s regime, despite the long road ahead ([BBC News](#)).

### **Wars & Security (Israel and Region)**

The Iran-linked group Ashab al Yamin claimed responsibility for a stabbing attack in London targeting two Jewish men, highlighting persistent threats to Jewish communities across Europe ([Long War Journal](#)). Concurrently, a Gaza-based charity founded by a Hamas operative continues to raise funds through a US platform, raising concerns about the financing of militant activities ([Long War Journal](#)).

On the geopolitical front, the US Commerce Department is targeting Chinese chipmakers to undercut China’s AI sector, reflecting intensifying technological competition ([FDD](#)). Meanwhile, reopening the Strait of Hormuz remains a strategic priority amid ongoing conflict with Iran ([FDD](#)).

In the United Kingdom, Lord Robertson emphasized the diminished defense capabilities resulting from overreliance on the US, urging a shift toward greater military autonomy



within Europe ([Chatham House](#)).

## **Global Macro & Geopolitics**

Oil prices have surged to their highest levels since 2022 following reports that the US Central Command has prepared plans for targeted strikes on Iran, further intensifying tensions in the Middle East ([BBC News](#)). Environmental concerns have also risen as Indonesia's bays are confirmed to be year-round hotspots for endangered whale sharks, underscoring the need for sustained conservation efforts ([France24](#)).

Meanwhile, a stranded whale in German waters is being transported to safety, drawing global attention to marine rescue operations ([BBC News](#)). Discussions at a high-level summit have emphasized the critical need to decouple economies from fossil fuels to ensure food sovereignty and global security ([France24](#)).

In legal news, a US court dismissed a hate speech lawsuit against Meta related to the Rohingya genocide, highlighting ongoing challenges in regulating online content ([The Diplomat](#)).

## **Pestilence & Global Health**

New archaeological discoveries in Jordan have revealed a mass grave from the Plague of Justinian, illustrating how pandemics can rapidly reshape societies ([ScienceDaily](#)). Scientists have also identified a hidden virus within gut bacteria that may be linked to colorectal cancer, offering promising avenues for early detection ([ScienceDaily](#)).

In medical advances, madecassic acid derived from a Korean herb has demonstrated potent activity against drug-resistant bacteria, signaling a breakthrough in antibiotic development ([ScienceDaily](#)). Additionally, research has uncovered how bacteria use gene transfer agents to "explode" and spread antibiotic resistance, deepening our understanding of microbial genetics ([ScienceDaily](#)).
