



Global Watch Daily – May 7, 2026

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A concise summary of significant developments in Israel and the world through a grounded Christian worldview.

Israel & Jerusalem

The IDF targeted rocket launchers used against troops in Lebanon without causing any injuries, demonstrating continued military vigilance in the region ([JNS](#); [BBC News](#)).

Meanwhile, controversy has arisen over an Israeli soldier's disrespectful act against a Virgin Mary statue in Lebanon, marking the second such incident involving Christian figures recently and raising concerns about religious sensitivities ([BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

On the economic front, Kela Technologies, an Israeli security firm that integrates commercial and military technologies, is on track to become a unicorn, backed by U.S. billionaires, underscoring Israel's strength in innovation ([JNS](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Regionally, Iran is considering a U.S. proposal to end hostilities, with Pakistan mediating efforts to transform a ceasefire into permanent peace. Meanwhile, Turkey has unveiled its first intercontinental ballistic missile, signaling a shift in military dynamics ([BBC News](#); [Al Jazeera](#)).

Wars & Security (Israel and Region)

The Strait of Hormuz remains a critical chokepoint as the U.S. launches "Project Freedom" to break Iran's blockade, significantly impacting global trade and supply chains ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Iran has intensified drone strikes against Kurdish opposition groups in northern Iraq as part of a broader campaign involving allied militias, while China seeks to facilitate a diplomatic resolution to the U.S.-Iran conflict without forcing Tehran to capitulate ([Long War Journal](#); [FDD](#)).

Hezbollah's increased use of fiber-optic guided FPV drones presents new challenges for Israeli forces, complicating defense efforts during the ongoing conflict. Meanwhile, Syrian authorities report dismantling a Hezbollah-linked assassination plot, highlighting the



volatile security environment ([Long War Journal](#); [Long War Journal](#)).

Global Macro & Geopolitics

China has announced the suspension of death sentences for former defense ministers amid a broader military leadership shakeup, signaling significant internal shifts ([BBC News](#) ; [The Diplomat](#)).

Passengers aboard a virus-affected ship were initially told it was not infectious despite a death, raising questions about public health communication. At the same time, French newsrooms face scrutiny over a lack of diversity, highlighting systemic challenges in media representation ([BBC News](#); [France24](#)).

A U.S. judge has released an alleged suicide note of Jeffrey Epstein, while Malaysia strengthens diplomatic ties with Tehran following the stranding of Malaysian oil tankers in the Persian Gulf, reflecting complex geopolitical interactions ([France24](#); [The Diplomat](#)).

Pestilence & Global Health

Scientists warn that free-living amoebae, which can harbor deadly microbes and resist heat and disinfectants, are spreading globally due to warming temperatures and outdated water systems. This situation necessitates improved surveillance and water treatment measures ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Archaeological discoveries of a 1,500-year-old mass grave in ancient Jordan reveal the devastating impact of the Plague of Justinian, illustrating how pandemics can rapidly concentrate populations and reshape societies beyond the mere spread of disease ([ScienceDaily](#)).

Natural Disasters & Signs in the Heavens

Recent seismic activity in California includes multiple minor earthquakes with magnitudes ranging from 0.3 to 1.1, recorded near The Geysers, Julian, and Imperial, underscoring ongoing tectonic activity ([USGS](#); [USGS](#)).

Cornell University students, sponsored by NASA, are advancing research into a national air transportation system for drones, aiming to enable the safe operation of thousands of drones simultaneously. Meanwhile, atmospheric phenomena near Antarctica continue to captivate scientists ([NASA](#); [NASA](#)).



Severe weather concerns persist across the U.S. Southeast, with fire weather risks and record warmth in the West, highlighting the diverse and extreme meteorological challenges faced nationwide ([weather.gov](https://www.weather.gov)).

Middle Eastern Artifacts

Recent archaeological work at Yeroḥam (West) has produced detailed location maps and plans of walls 108-111 and 129-130, contributing to a deeper understanding of the site's layout and historical context ([Israel Antiquities Authority](https://www.israelantiquitiesauthority.org/); [Israel Antiquities Authority](https://www.israelantiquitiesauthority.org/)).

Additional finds include wall 109, looking east; a newly conserved ritual bath from the Second Temple period at Tel Hebron; and recovered multispectral images of Paul's letters in the 6th-century Codex H, enriching biblical and historical scholarship ([Israel Antiquities Authority](https://www.israelantiquitiesauthority.org/); [BiblePlaces](https://www.bibleplaces.org/)).

Noteworthy discoveries also include a massive statue likely representing Ramses II, an Egyptian stela depicting the Roman emperor Tiberius in Egyptian regalia, and a well-preserved statue of Athena from Laodicea's Western Theater, reflecting the region's rich cultural heritage ([BiblePlaces](https://www.bibleplaces.org/)).
